

MINUTES OF Regular MEETING OF THE CITY
COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS,
HELD March 4th, 1952, at 7:30 P. M.

On the 4th day of March, 1952, A. D., the City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas, convened in Regular Session, in the regular meeting place in said City, with the following members thereof, to-wit:

constituting a quorum when the following business was transacted:

1. The Commission approved the minutes of the meeting of February 5, 1952, on motion of Commissioner Snell, seconded by Commissioner Treadwell; approved the minutes of the meeting of February 25th, 1952, on motion of Commissioner Treadwell, seconded by Commissioner Snell.

2. The bills were approved to be paid on motion of Commissioner Stegall, seconded by Commissioner Snell.

3. After considering evidence presented in behalf of Roy Bazzoon's application for a taxicab license, the Commission found no public necessity for the issuance of such license.

4. The Commission approved the W. D. Dylum Addition as presented, subject to the extension of the utility easement through Lots 1 and 2 to Bynum Street. The motion was made by Commissioner Treadwell, seconded by Commissioner Stegall.

5. The J. H. Purvis zone change, as advertised, was approved on motion of Commissioner Stegall, seconded by Commissioner Snell.

6. The Commission voted approval of a resolution deeding to the property owners in Block 3, Treadwell Addition, an alley running East and West, but retained a utility easement right.

7. The State Highway Department's recommendation on speed limits on all State Highways in the City Limits was not acceptable to the Commission.

8. The Commission approved a request by the Forestry Service that the Forestry Service and the schools be permitted to use certain city properties in a re-forestation program.

9. The Commission approved a suggestion that the Mayor wire certain Congressmen and request their opposition vote to the Tidelands Bill now before Congress.
