

MINUTES OF Regular MEETING OF THE CITY COMMISSION
OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS, HELD March 2nd
1943 AT 7:30 PM.

On this the 2nd day of March, A. D. 1943,
the City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas, convened in
Regular session, in the regular meeting place in said

being present, and the following absent: Cary C. Trevathan,
constituting a quorum when the following business was transacted:

Minutes of all meetings held during the month of February
were read and regularly approved.

Mr. LaGrone, County Agricultural Agent and requested ap-
proval from the City Commission for poisoning birds in the
city for protection of gardens.

After discussion, motion was
made by B. F. Milligan, second by R. L. Melvin to permit the use
of poison for the destruction of sparrows and the motion was
carried by W. L. Glenn, R. L. Melvin and B. F. Milligan voting yea
and Jas. A. Abney voting nay.

D. O. Wallis and several other residents of the City living
on Hoskins Street appeared in the interest of securing oil
treatment for their street, which is not paved.

Without for-
mal action, the City Manager was requested to prepare an
estimate of the cost to properly oil the street and submit
to the property owners and find out if they would pay the
part apportioned to them, which would be the cost of the oil.

Mr. Gibbs, representing the East Texas Laundry and Mr.
Hollemon, representing Hollemons Laundry requested consideration
of the City water rates as apply to Industries, with the view
to making a reduction in the rates charged.

The matter was
taken for consideration and investigation.

Matters with reference to W. Y. A. house on Denman Avenue being
vacated and also the matter of passing an ordinance regulating
dogs running at large in the city were discussed but no formal
action taken.

The meeting was recessed to March 3th at 9:30 A. M.
