MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS, HELD SEPTEMBER 16, 1952, AT 7:30 P.M.

On this the 16th day of September, A.D., 1952, the City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas, convened in Regular Session in the regular meeting place in said City, with the following members thereof being present:

Granville Wright.....Mayor

- and the City Manager and the City Secretary were absent: a quorum being present, the following business was transacted:
- The minutes of the regular meeting held on the 2nd day of September and the called meeting held on the 5th day of September, 1952, were read and approved by the City Commission.
- 2 Mr. W. C. Royle and other residents along Alton Street, appeared before the City Commission and complained about the oil, grease and water from filing stations on Timberland Drive flowing down Alton Street and washing the ditches deeper and causing an unpleasant odor along said street. The City Commission informed them that they would take the matter up with the State Highway Department and see if the condition could not be corrected. Also they advised that the City Engineer would make an investigation and report back to the City Commission as to the best method of handling the situation complained of.
- 3. In compliance with a request from the State Highway Department, the business route for U. S. Highway 59 was designated from the intersection of Timberland Drive and Humason Street along Humason Street to North 1st Street, thence along North 1st Street in a Southerly direction through the business district to the intersection of South 1st Street and Timberland Drive.
- 4. The City Commission voted to purchase the necessary wire needed for the rewiring of the signals leading into the Fire Station. The cost of the wire amounting to approximately \$621.00.

said lease for and on behalf of the City of Lufkin.

6. Since the resignation of Harry Steenson as City Manager, the Commission voted to have an audit made of the city books from the time of the last annual audit until the date of the resignation of Mr. Steenson, and the City was authorized to take bids for such supplemental audit.

7. Since the City was without a City Manager and a City Secretary, Joe McClendon was unanimously appointed, Acting City Manager, and Mrs. Loraine Webb also was unanimously appointed, Acting City Secretary, each to act in such capacity until a permanent City Manager and City Secretary may be selected.

There being no forther business to come before the City Commission, the meeting adjourned.
