## MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS, HELD Feb. 4th, 1936.

Be it remembered that on this the 4th day of February A.D. 1936, there was begun and holden a regular meeting of the City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas, at the Municipal Office in said City with the following officers of the City present and presiding, to-wit:

Minutes of meetings held during the month of January, were read and on motion duly made and carried were approved as read.

Mrs Boley Thomas and her husband appeared before the City Commission and made complaint against George Powell and Ike Turner, policemen, to the effect that they had failed to show proper respect due them as citizens and that they broke the door open by force against their will. Such action growing out of an effort which resulted in the arrest of one Luther Renfro, brokher of Mrs. Thomas, who was wanted on a felony charge. Theywere listened to and were promised to give the matter consideration after they had considered both sides of the matter. They Mayor speaking for the City Commission expressed his regrets that such thing had happened and offered the apologies of the City for same. After due and deliberate consideration of the matter, no action was taken against the policemen aforsaid.

The matter was discussed as to whether such ordinance should provide one hour or two hour parking limit. It was finally moved by Lewis Hicks and seconded by W. O. Greene that said ordinance limiting to ONE hour parking be NOT passed on second reading. The motion was put by the Mayor and the following is the recorded vote on the same. An Ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE LIMITING TO TWO HOURS PARKING OF MOTOR AND OTHER VEHICLES FROM 9 6'CLOCK A.M. TO 6 O'CLOCK P.M. ON FIRST STREET FROM SHEPHERD AVENUE TO ST.
