The following proceedings were had, to-wit:

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A Resolution entitled "RESOLUTION FIXING MINIMUM WAGE RATES" under P.W.A. Docket TEX-2137-F, being a Project wherein the City of Lufkin, with the aid of Public Works Administration is making preparation to make extensive improvements to its Waterworks and Sewer Systems, was introduced for passage and approval. J. E. Jay, Commissioner of Ward No. 4 made a motion that said Resolution be passed and approved. W.D.Winston, Jr. Commissioner of Ward No. 1, seconded the motion. The Mayor put the question and the following is the recorded vote on the motion: "AYES" - W.M.Glenn, W.D.Winston, Jr., Lewis Hicks, J.B.Perry and J. E. Jay. "NOES" - None. Whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried and the resolution adopted and approved. (See another page of these minutes for a record of the Resolution)

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A Resolution entitled "RESOLUTION NOMINATING ENGINEER OR ARCHITECT" under P.W.A. Docket TEX-2137-F, being a project wherein the City of Lufkin, with the aid of the Public Works Administration is making preparation to make extensive improvements to its waterworks and sewer systems, was introduced for passage and approval. W.D.Winston, Jr. Commissioner of Ward No. 1 made a motion that said resolution be passed and approved. J.E. Jay, Commissioner of Ward No. 4 seconded the motion. The Mayor put the question and the following is the recorded vote on the motion: "AYES" - W. M. Glenn, W. D. Winston, Lewis Hicks, J. B. Perry and J. E. Jay. "NOES" - None. 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An Ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS, AMENDING AN ORDINANCE PASSED AND APPROVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS, ON THE 13th DAY OF OCTOBER, A.D. 1938, WHICH SAID ORDINANCE PROHIBITS THE SALE OF BEER, WINE, MALT OR VINOUS LIQUORS OR ANY ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES WITHIN THE RESIDENTIAL SECTIONS OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN, SAVE AND EXCEPT CERTAIN DESIGNATED AREAS AS PROVIDED IN SAID ORDINANCE"

was introduced for passage and approval as an emergency ordinance. W. D. Winston, Jr. made a motion that said ordinance be read to the City Commission and that it be passed and approved as an emergency ordinance. J. E. Jay seconded the motion. The Mayor put the question and the following is the recorded vote on the motion: "AYES"- W.M.Glenn, W.D.Winston, Jr., Lewis Hicks, J. B. Perry and J. E. Jay. "NOES" - None. Whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried and the ordinance duly passed as an emergency ordinance. (See another page of these minutes for a record of said ordinance)

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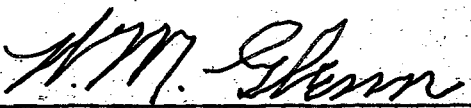
An application or request having been made to the City Commission for amendment of the Beer Ordinance so as to allow the sale of Beer on Lining Street and on Cotton Belt Avenue, and the same having been duly considered, it was moved by Lewis Hicks that such amendment be not made. W.D.Winston, Jr. seconded the motion, and the mayor put the question and the motion carried unanimously.

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There being no further business to come before the meeting, on motion duly made and carried, it adjourned.
