MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING
OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF
LUFKIN, TEXAS, HELD NOV.
4th, 1924.

Be it remembered that on this the 4th day of November, A. D. 1924,
there came on and was held a regular meeting of the Honorable City Com-
mission of the City of Lufkin, in the City Hall of said City, there being
present and presiding the following officers: Sam H. Kerr, Mayor, C. F.
Becker, Commissioner of Ward No. 1, A. M. Walker, Commissioner of Ward
No. 2, W. A. Behannon, Commissioner of Ward No. 3, K. Hoskins, Commissioner
of Ward No. 4, and C. N. Humason, City Manager, W. O. Seale, City Attorney,
and C. H. Rice, Assistant Secretary, when the following proceedings were
had, to-wit:-

Minutes of former meeting read, and by move and second duly made and car-
ried were approved.

The following styled ordinance was presented for passage and approval,
to-wit:-

"AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND ORDINANCE TO PROHIBIT THE ERECTION OF ANY
TENT OR OTHER BUILDING WITHIN 600 FEET OF A PRIVATE RESIDENCE TO BE USED
BY A CARNIVAL SHOW OR ANY PLACE OF AMUSEMENT IN CONNECTION WITH A CARNIVAL
SHOW, OF DATE MARCH 6, A. D. 1923 BY ADDING A SECTION THERETO TO ALSO PRO-
HIBITING ANY TEN SHOWS, SKATING RINKS OR OTHER AMUSEMENTS WITHIN 600 feet
OF A PRIVATE RESIDENCE, AFFIXING PENALTY AND CREATING AN EMERGENCY".

Commissioner A. M. Walker moved that the ordinance be placed on its
first reading; seconded by Kenneth Hoskins, and carried by the following
vote: "Aye"- Sam H. Kerr, C. F. Becker, A. M. Walker, W. A. Behannon and
Kenneth Hoskins. "NO"- None. Carried. Ordinance placed on first reading.

Commissioner C. F. Becker moved that the ordinance pass first reading;
seconded by W. A. Behannon, and carried by the following vote: "AYE" Sam
H. Kerr, C. F. Becker, A. M. Walker, W. A. Behannon and Kenneth Hoskins.
"NO"- None. Carried; Ordinance passed first reading.

Commissioner W. A. Behannon moved that the rules be suspended and that
the ordinance be placed on second reading; seconded by A. M. Walker, and
carried by the following vote:- "AYE" Sam H. Kerr, C. F. Becker, A. M.
Walker, W. A. Behannon and Kenneth Hoskins. "NO"- None. Carried; ordinance
placed on second reading.

Commissioner Kenneth Hoskins moved that the ordinance pass second
reading; seconded by Commissioner C. F. Becker, and carried by the following
vote; "AYE"- Sam H. Kerr, C. F. Becker, A. M. Walker, W. A. Behannon and
Kenneth Hoskins. "NO"- None. Carried. Ordinance passed second reading.
Mayor, Sam H. Kerr, then declared the ordinance finally passed. The Ordi-
nance appears of record elsewhere in these minutes.

Commissioner C. F. Becker moved that the ordinance be placed on its first reading; seconded by Commissioner A. M. Walker and carried by the following vote: "AYE"- Sam H. Kerr, C. F. Becker, A. M. Walker, W. A. Behannon and Kenneth Hoskins. "NO"- None. Carried. Ordinance placed on first reading.

Commissioner W. A. Behannon moved that the ordinance pass first reading; seconded by Commissioner Kenneth Hoskins, and carried by the following vote:- Sam H. Kerr, C. F. Becker, A. M. Walker, W. A. Behannon and Kenneth Hoskins. "NO" - None. Carried. Ordinance passed first reading.

Sam H. Townsend appeared before the City Commission and demanded that a bill of \$150.00 be allowed him for expense in connection with filling of property back of his residence, such property being the old road way. By move and second duly made and carried the matter was tabled.

"A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO SEND FIRE FIGHTING EQUIPMENT TO AID ANY NEIGHBORING CITY CALLING FOR ASSISTANCE IN CASE OF FIRE ~~SAVING~~ CONTROL BEYOND THEIR FIRE FIGHTING CAPACITY".

Commissioner Kenneth Hoskins moved that the resolution be placed on its first reading; seconded by Commissioner A. M. Walker, and carried by the following vote: "AYE" - Sam H. Kerr, C. F. Becker, A. M. Walker, W.A. Behannon and Kenneth Hoskins. "NO" None- Carried; Ordinance placed on first reading.

Commissioner W. A. Behannon moved that the resolution pass its first reading; seconded by Commissioner C. F. Becker and carried by the following vote: "AYES"- Sam H. Kerr, C. F. Becker, A. M. Walker, W. A. Behannon and Kenneth Hoskins. "NO"- None- Carried. ~~Ordinance~~ Resolution passed first reading.

Commissioner C. F. Becker moved that the rules be suspended and that the resolution be placed on second reading; seconded by Commissioner A. M. Walker, and carried by the following vote:- "AYES"- Sam H. Kerr, C. F. Becker, A. M. Walker, W. A. Behannon and Kenneth Hoskins. "NO"- None- Carried. Commissioner W. A. Behannon moved that the resolution pass second reading; seconded by Commissioner Kenneth Hoskins and carried by the following vote: "AYES"- Sam H. Kerr, C. F. Becker, A. M. Walker, W. A. Behannon, and Kenneth Hoskins. "NO"- None- Carried. Resolution passed second reading.
