

MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING
OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY
OF LUFKIN, TEXAS, HELD
JANUARY 5th, 1932.

Be it remembered that on this the 5th day of January, A.D. 1932,
there was begun and holden a regular meeting of the City Commission of
the City of Lufkin, Texas, at the Municipal Office in said City, with
the following officers of the City present and presiding, to-wit:-

when the following proceedings were had, to-wit:-

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Minutes of former meetings read, and on motion duly made and carried were approved as read.

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The matter of passing a resolution protesting against the granting of a certificate of convenience and necessity to the Herrin Transportation Company to operate a common carrier motor service inter and intrastate from Houston to Texas-Louisiana State line, via Lufkin and other towns in this section, was taken up and considered by the City Commission. After careful consideration of said question, it was moved by W. O. Greene and seconded by C. A. Burke, that such a resolution be adopted, The Motion Carried ~~unanimously~~. ^{by a majority vote of the City Commission, W.A. Abney voting "No"} The resolution is as follows:-

"WHEREAS, the City Commission of the City of Lufkin has been advised that the Railroad Commission of Texas will hold hearing on Tuesday, January 12th, 1932, in the City of Beaumont, for the purpose of considering the application of the Herrin Transportation Company for certificate of convenience and necessity to operate a common carrier motor service inter and intrastate from Houston to Texas-Louisiana State Line, via Lufkin, Nacogdoches, Henderson, Longview and Marshal, and from Nacogdoches to Texas-Louisiana State Line via Teneha on a route from Houston to Shreveport.

Whereas, it is known to this Council that the City of Lufkin is adequately served by both rail and motor carriers, and that the granting of this certificate is not required for the public convenience and necessity of this community.

Whereas, this Council realizes that our roads and streets are not at present in condition to accommodate this traffic, and the granting of this certificate would only increase the present congested condition,

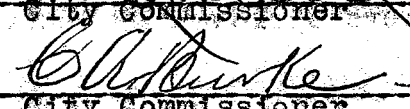
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add to the heavy burden now borne by these roads and streets, interfere with traffic and further menace the lives of persons using such roads and streets:

NOW, THEREFORE: BE IT RESOLVED, that this council goes on record before the Railroad Commission of Texas, as requesting that this application be denied, and:

Be it further Resolved, that this resolution is hereby adopted on this the 5th day of January, and is ordered that a copy of this resolution be filed with the Railroad Commission of Texas to indicate to such Railroad Commission the attitude of this Council with reference to the use of streets of this City. -
