MINUTES OF A CALLED MEETING OF THE CITY COMMISSION  
OF LUFKIN, TEXAS, HELD ON NOVEMBER 13, 1946 AT  
10:00 A. M.

On this, the thirteenth day of November, 1946, A. D., the City Commission met in a called meeting in the First State Bank in said City, with the following members, thereof, to-wit:

W. D. Winson, Jr	Mayor

being present, with Dorsie Hawkins, City Secretary; and C. E. Brazil, City Attorney, being absent, when a quorum was constituted when the following business was transacted:

1. This meeting was called for the purpose of discussing the completion of bathhouse at the Municipal Swimming Pool. It was pointed out that the City had received permission to complete the bathhouse too late to carry on the work simultaneously with the pool and that Mr. Early and Mr. Thrash of the City, and Mr. Landon of Paddock Engineering Company, had met and discussed the possibility of completing the original contract for Item 2.


2. Mr. Landon agreed to perform the work originally proposed in item 2, on condition that he be allowed an increase of \$1200.00 (twelve hundred dollars). He based this increase on the fact that the work would take from two to three months longer and require that he keep a superintendent on the job, which cost would have been absorbed in the original estimate had he been able to do both units at the same time. He had also called attention to the increase in the cost of materials, particularly the increase on the cost of brick.


3. After the above facts were presented, the Council unanimously agreed to allow the increase and authorized the City Manager to draw up a new contract with Paddock Engineering Company for completion of Unit 2.

No further business was presented so the meeting adjourned.
