Minutes of meetings held during the month of March 1937 were read and on motion duly made and carried were approved as read.

Mr. Clyde Stegall of Nacogdoches, Texas, appeared before the City Commission regarding delinquent Taxes due by the Mrs. Ella Stegall Estate to the City of Lufkin, Texas. He stated that he understood that suits were being filed for the collection of City Taxes, and that he understood that suit had been filed in this case. He stated that he did not want suit to proceed to the point of judgment being taken; that he had been trying to make arrangement for funds to pay the taxes and that he would continue to do so and would pay just as soon as it was possible. He refused to permit any rents now being paid for use of the property to be paid to the City and applied to the payment of the City Taxes. The City commission, after hearing his plea and considering the matter were unanimous in their opinion and it was so ordered that suit proceed and that the matter be reduced to judgment as soon as possible.

RESOLUTION CREATING THE OFFICE OF SANITARY ENGINNER-BACTERIOLOGIST.

Whereas, it appears to the City Commission that it would serve a great benefit to the citizenship of the City of Lufkin, Texas, to create the office of City Emitary Engineer-Bacteriologist and fill such office with a person well qualified for such position. THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS, that the office of Sanitary Engineer-Bacterilogist be and it is hereby created, and that the City Manager be, and he is hereby empowered and it is hereby made his duty to appoint a suitable and well qualified person to such position and that such appointment be made known to the City Commission

for approval and confirmation. The Duty of the Sanitary Enginner-Bacteriologist shall be to regulate all sanitary conditions in the city or within the police jurisdiction thereof by serving proper notices eigher by personal contact or by written notice calling attention to any and all unmanitary conditions found, with the request that such conditions be corrected as soon as possible; to inspect all establishments where food is handled and recommend the proper and lawful method of handling foods and to see to it that all State, Federal and City laws and ordinances are fully complied with regarding any sanitary condition where such condition is a menace to health and to see that all laws and ordinances regulating the handling of food of any kind are fully complied with. He shall have the power to make lawful complaint against any person who violates any law or ordinance that is in force for the purpose ofmaking all places, private or public, sanitary and healthful insofar as is physically possible and he shall have the power to make lawful and proper complaint against any person that violates any law or ordinance that provides a proper method for the handling of any food product whatsoever.
