

MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING OF THE CITY COMMISSION
OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS, HELD NOVEMBER 6,
1956, AT 7:30 P.M.

On this the 6 day of November, A. D. 1956,
the City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas, convened
in regular session, in the regular meeting place in

ing business was transacted:


1. The meeting was opened with prayer by Mayor Woodrow W. Scott.
2. The minutes of the regular meeting of October 16, 1956, were read and approved.
3. Bids on two additional water system projects were opened but the contracts were not awarded and the delay was granted in order that the City Engineer might have time to tabulate the bids to determine who were the lowest and best bidders. Eleven bids were submitted and it was agreed that the lowest bidders would be announced at the next meeting of the City Commission.
4. Mr. John Hensley appeared before the Commission in the interest of the City Lake Recreational Project and reported that the prize winning letter of J. O. Booker, Jr., expressed generally the program adopted by himself and other sportsment of the City. The matter was delayed in order to give the Commission more time in which to study the letter and program which was outlined by Mr. Hensley, Mr. Booker, and Mr. John S. Redditt.
5. An estimate report of the progress of the H. H. Null Pipe Line Contractors, Inc., was presented to the Commission and payment was authorized on the estimate of the construction completed.

6. The Commission approved the estimate report as submitted by Wilks, Dake & Steed on their contract and such estimate was approved and ordered paid.

7. Norris Gipson appeared before the Commission and withdrew any claim for damages he might have by reason of the construction of an additional water line over the original Easement heretofore obtained by the City Commission. He stated that he did not want to become involved in any controversy with the City, and requested that any claim for damages that he might have, be withdrawn and the matter dropped.


8. The Mayor read several letters from applicants for the job of City Manager, but no action was taken.
