

MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING OF THE
CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS,
HELD MAY 4th, A. D. 1926.

Be it remembered that on this the 4th day of May, A. D. 1926, there was begun and helden a regular meeting of the City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas, at the Municipal Office thereof in said City. Present and presiding the J. W. Hawkins, Mayor, Joe C. Denman, Commissioner of Ward No. 1, A. M. Walker, Commissioner of Ward No. 2, W. A. Behannen, Commissioner of Ward No. 3, E. W. Leach, Commissioner of Ward No. 4, T. L. Dunn, City Secretary and Acting City Manager, W. O. Seale, City Attorney, when the following proceedings were had, to-wit:-

Minutes of former meetings read, and on motion duly made and carried were approved as read.

Mr. M. T. Gipson, representative of the Lufkin Volunteer Fire Department appeared as one member of a committee to urge City Commission to make an allowance of \$25.00 to each of eight men, delegates to the State Firemen's Convention, to partly defray the expense of attending said convention. After discussion of the question and deliberation of same it was moved by A. M. Walker and Seconded by E. W. Leach that such allowance be made. The motion carried unanimously.

Sam H. Kerr, et als appeared on behalf of the Fire Department and urged the building of a new fire station. After discussion the question City Attorney Seale was instructed to look up the law relative to the voting and issuing of bonds for said purpose and to report at the next regular meeting of the Commission.

Mr. Frank R. Flanigan appeared in person and requested the City Commission to execute to him an oil and gas lease on certain city properties. Action was deferred on same until Friday Night, May 7th, 1926.

Accounts and bills due by the City to varieus parties, firms and corporations were presented for payment, and it appearing that such of said bills as had been properly audited and approved by the City Manager should be paid, on motion duly made and carried, same were allowed as appears in minutes of accounts allowed.
