MINUTES OF A CALL MEETING OF THE CITY  
COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS, HELD  
JUNE 8th, A. D. 1929.

Be it remembered that on this the 2nd day of June, A. D. 1929, there was begun and holden a call meeting of the City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas, at the City Hall in said City: Present and presiding the following officers of the city, to-wit: + Joe C. Denman, Mayor, C. E. Brazil, Commissioner of Ward No. 1, C. A. Burke, Commissioner of Ward No. 2, R. C. Jordan, Commissioner of Ward No. 3, W. A. Abney, Commissioner of Ward No. 4, W. O. Seale, City Attorney and T. L. Dunn, City Secretary. (V.R. Smitham, City Manager was absent-out of City), when the following proceedings were had, to-wit:-

Pursuant to written notice herein the City Commission met to pass on second reading an ordinance granting to Dixie Gas & Fuel Co. a Gas franchise, and to do and perform any such other business as might properly come before the meeting.

An ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN, ANGELINA COUNTY, TEXAS, GRANTING TO DIXIE GAS AND FUEL COMPANY THE RIGHT AND PRIVILEGE AND FRANCHISE TO LAY GAS MAINS ALONG THE STREETS, AVENUES, ALLEYS, ROADS AND HIGHWAYS AND OTHER PUBLIC PLACES OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN, ANGELINA COUNTY, TEXAS, FOR THE PURPOSE OF DISTRIBUTING AND SELLING NATURAL GAS OR MANUFACTURED GAS TO THE INHABITANTS OF SAID CITY AND TO OTHERS; AND ALSO TO LAY PIPE LINES IN THE STREETS, AVENUES, ALLEYS, HIGHWAYS, ROADS AND OTHER PUBLIC PLACES AND GROUNDS OF SAID CITY FOR THE PURPOSE OF CONVEYING NATURAL GAS OR MANUFACTURED GAS THROUGH AND WITHIN SAID CITY FOR DISTRIBUTING NATURAL GAS OR MANUFACTURED GAS TO THE INHABITANTS OF SAID CITY, AND TO TOJERS BEYOND THE LIMITS OF SAID CITY OF LUFKIN, ANGELINA COUNTY, TEXAS, BOTH FOR INDUSTRIAL AND DOMESTIC PURPOSES AND PROVIDING FOR THE REGULATIONS FOR THE CONDUCT OF SAID GAS DISTRIBUTIONS SYSTEM" was presented for passage ~~for examination~~ and approval on ~~second~~ and final reading. C. A. Burke made a motion that said ordinance be placed on second and final reading and that same pass said second and final reading. Said motion was seconded by C.E.Brazil. The Mayor put the question and requested all members of the City Commission who favored said motion to vote "Aye" and those opposed to vote "No". The following vote is recorded: "Ayes"- Joe C. Denman, C.E.Brazil, C.A. Burke, R.C. Jordan and W.A. Abney. "Noes"- None- Whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried and said ordinance finally passed on ~~second~~ and final reading.
