MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COMMISSION HELD Jan. 2nd. 1923.

Be it remembered that on this the 2nd day of January A.D. 1923, there was begun and holden a regular meeting of the City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas, at the Municipal Office thereof in said City: Present and presiding the Hon. G. A. Kelley, Mayor, S. R. Parker, Commission of Ward No. 1, E. E. Woods, Commission of Ward No. 2, W. B. Treadwell, Commissioner of Ward No. 4, (B.L.Zeagler, Commission of Ward No. 3 being absent) C. N. Humason, City Manager, and T. L. Dunn, City Secretary, when the following proceedings were had, to-wit:-

Minutes of former meetings read, and by move and second duly made and carried, were approved as read.

City Manager, C. N. Humason, reported that the old East Texas Depot was in a dilapidated condition; that the building is leaning on account of it being in a decayed condition and that same would likely be blown down and injure the occupants of same; that same is very unsightly and unsanitary.

The above report having been heard by the city Commission, it was moved by Commissioner Treadwell and Seconded by Commissioner S. R. Parker to accept said report and for the city Manager to be instructed to have City Engineer make investigation of said building as to its condition from a standpoint of safety, deteroration and sanitation, and that he makehis report at the next regular meeting of this Commission; and further, that if the condition of said building is found to be in violation of any city ordinance that the necessary steps or proceedure be taken as prescribed by ordinance to have corrected such violation. The Motion carried unsnimously.

All accounts and bills due by the city to various partiesm firms and corporations were presented for payment, and it appearing that thos bills as have been properly audited and allowed by the City Manager should be paid, by move and second duly made and carried same were allowed and the the City Secretary instructed to write warrathts in payment of same.

The report of City Manager C.N. Humason, that the well which had be contracted to be bored by W.W. Miller & Sons, had been completed as per said contract, and the log of said well have been read to the City Commission, by move and second duly made and carried, said report and log was duly accepted.

The report of the City Engineer and City Health Officer was to the condition of the Old Abram Warehouse was read and by move and second duly made and carried were accepted, and the matter referred to the City Attorney for further consideration and proceedure as to have said nuisance removed.

The Eastex Syrup Corporation made written application to lease a part of Seventh Street to be used for warehouse purposes, and by move and second duly made and carried said application was granted and the city Attorney instructed to draw up a lease in accordance with said application.

It appearing that the office City Recorder or Judge of the Corporation Court was vacant because of the resignation of J. T. Maroney, it was moved and duly seconded that T. L. Dunn, be and he is hereby appointed to said position.
