MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING OF THE  
CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN,  
TEXAS HELD OCTOBER 2nd, 1923.

Be it remembered that on this the 2nd day of October, A.D. 1923, there was begun and holden a regular meeting of the City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas, at the Municipal office thereof in said city. Present and presiding the Hon. Sam H. Kerr, Mayor, C. F. Becker, Commissioner of Ward No. 1, J. W. Lewis, Commissioner of Ward No. 2, W. A. Behannon, Commissioner of Ward No. 3 and W. B. Treadwell, Commissioner of Ward No. 4, C. N. Humason, City Manager, T. L. Dunn, City secretary and W. O. Seale, City Attorney, when the following proceedings were had, to-wit:-

Minutes of the September 1923 regular meeting read and by move and second duly made and carried, were adopted as read.

-----oOo-----

Heretofore the City Attorney was instructed to draw a contract between the City of Lufkin and I.D. Fairchild and A.L. Boynton for the construction of a water and sewer lines through their addition in the Northern Part of the City. Said contract was drawn and submitted to the said Fairchild and Boynton but they refused to accept same, but submitted one in lieu thereof. After due consideration of the one submitted by the said Fairchild & Boynton it was accepted with the following changes, to-wit:- Such contract shall not provide for any interest charge whatever until such time as the revenues from water and sewer connections shall amount to 8% or more, then at that time the City has the right to take same over by paying to the said Fairchild & Boynton the amount expended in the construction of said lines, but if same is not taken over the city will pay to the said Fairchild & Boynton 6% on the amount so expended in the construction of said lines by them for a period of one year or so much longer as it may be before said lines are taken over by the City.

An Ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE RUNNING OF AUTOMOBILES AND MOTOR VEHICLES, OF DATE MAY 9th A.D. 1914, AND AMENDMENT THERETO OF DATE MAY 14th A.D. 1919, FIXING PENALTY AND CREATING AN EMERGENCY" was submitted by the City Attorney for passage and approval as an emergency measure. After the consideration of same it was moved by Commissioner J.W. Lewis and

ended by Commissioner C. F. Becker that the rules requiring ordinances to be read at two stated meetings be suspended and this ordinance placed on second and final reading and to take effect after publication, on October 5th, 1923. The Mayor then put the question and requested those members of the City Commission who favored said motion and the passage of said ordinance to vote "Aye" and those who opposed same to vote "No". The following members voted "Aye"-Sam H. Kerr, C.F.Becker, J.W.Lewis, W. A. Behannon and W.B.Treadwell; The following members voted "No" None. The Mayor declared the motion carried and the ordinance finally passed and approved.

An ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE CLEANING AND KEEPING CLEAN OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN, AND PROVIDING SANITARY RULES AND ABATEMENT OF NUISANCES, OF DATE MAY 9th. A.D. 1914 BY ADDING THERETO SECTIONS ~~34A~~ and 34B PROHIBITING THE INSTALLING, MAINTAINING AND OPERATION OF A GASOLENE STATION OR AN OIL STATION ON THE SIDEWALK IN THE FIRE LIMITS OF THE CITY, PROVIDING PENALTY AND MAKING EACH DAY OF ~~24~~ HOURS A SEPARATE OFFENSE FOR VIOLATION THEREOF, AND CREATING AN EMERGENCY". was submitted for passage and approval as an emergency measure. After due and deliberate consideration of said ordinance it was moved by commissioner W.B.Treadwell and seconded by Commissioner W.A.Behannon that the rules requiring ordinances to be read at two stated meetings be suspended and this ordinance placed on second and final reading and be passed and approved and take effect from and after publication on October 5th, 1923. The Mayor then put the question and requested all members of the City Commission who favored the motion and the passage of said ordinance to vote "Aye" and those who opposed same to vote "No". The following members voted "Aye" Sam H.Kerr, C.F.Becker, J.W.Lewis, W.A.Behannon and W.B.Treadwell. the following members voted "No"-None. Whereupon the mayor declared the motion carried and the ordinance finally passed and approved.

An ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 23 OF AN ELECTRICAL ORDINANCE OF DATE APRIL 3rd. A.D.1923 BY CANCELLING SAID SECTION IN FULL", was presented for passage and approval. After due consideration of said ordinance it was moved by Commissioner W. A. Behannon and seconded by Commissioner J.W.Lewis that said ordinance be passed and approved. The mayor put the question and requested all

members of the City Commission who favored the passage of said Ordinance and said motion to vote "Aye" and those who opposed same to vote "No". The following members voted "Aye" Sam H. Kerr, C. F. Becker, J. W. Lewis, W. A. Behannon and W. B. Treadwell. The following members voted "No"- None. Whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried and the ordinance passed and approved.

The question as to whether or not the City should charge a certain part of the water that had been first used by The Lufkin Steam Bottling Works and W. A. Collmorgen to the Lufkin Electric Light and Power Company came up for discussion. After due consideration of the question it was moved by Commissioner J. W. Lewis and seconded by Commissioner C. F. Becker that the City charge each party, The Lufkin Steam Bottling Works and W. A. Collmorgen with the total amount of water used through their respective meters and to collect from them the amount due as shown by said meter readings. The Mayor put the question and the motion carried unanimously.

-----oOo-----

It appearing that it is necessary to purchase a traveling crane and appurtenances for the Water Works plant, it was moved by J. W. Lewis and seconded by W. A. Behannon that C. N. Humason, C. F. Becker and Tom. Russell be appointed as a committee to make the purchase to the best interest of the City. Said motion carried and the Mayor appointed said men as a committee as aforesaid.

All accounts and bills due by the city to various parties, firms and corporations were presented for allowance, and it appearing that such of said accounts and bills as had been audited and allowed by the City Manager should be paid, by move and second same were allowed, and the City secretary instructed to issue City warrants in payment of same, viz:- Lufkin Rock Co. \$22.50; Western Union Telg Co. \$4.77; Hopper's Filling Station \$32.69; Lufkin Filling Station, \$18.57; Norville-Wilder Hdw. There being no further business to come before the meeting, by move and second duly made and carried same adjourned.


