

MINUTES OF A CALL MEETING OF
THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN,
TEXAS, HELD ~~MAY~~ 30th, 1930.

Be it remembered that on the 30th day of May A.D. 1930, there was held a call meeting of the City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas, at the Municipal Office of said City, with the following officers of the City present and presiding: Joe C. 


There being no further business to come before the meeting, on motion duly made and carried said meeting adjourned.
