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MINUTES OF A CALL MEETING OF THE CITY
COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS, HELD
SEPTEMBER 8th, A.D. 1939.

Be it remembered that on this 8th day of September A.D. 1939, there was begun and holden a Special meeting of the City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas, at the Municipal Office in said City with the following officers of the city present and presiding, to-wit:

The following proceedings were had to-wit:

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1. Mr. Bob Carney, Representative for Sharpe & Stevenson, requesting City of Lufkin to let them connect on the Water & Sewer Lines in the Sharpe & Stevenson Addition to the City of Lufkin. Mr. Stine said that they were to pay for same (Previous Connections) when connections were made(not including the Mains) and they to lay the lines themselves. A Motion was made by R. C. Arnett that Sharpe & Stevenson grant the City of Lufkin, Texas, an Easement(Pipe Line) through the Sharpe & Stevenson addition before any more connections would be made on the City's line. The motion was seconded by W. D. Winston. The Mayor put the question to a vote--all voted "AYE". "Noes"--None.

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2. Mr. Ritchie, representative of Sharpe & Stevenson present, and soliciting part of the City's Fire Insurance Business. Otto Brittian and Jim Pinkerton explained that City should check back several years and see how much taxes were paid, what each representative has really been worth to the Community in a Civic Minded way. The Council authorized the Mayor, City Manager and City Secretary to work out some kind of plan.

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3. Accounts and bills due by the city to various parties, firms and corporations were presented for payment and it appearing that such or said bills as had been properly audited and approved for payment by the City Manager should be paid, on motion duly made and carried were ordered paid.

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4. The proposition of building a new city hall was discussed, and some had the idea of getting it through the N.Y.A.--and would discuss it with Jesse Kellam on the 19th of Sept. at the formal opening of the new Community Center Building.

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5. Written application by Dr. C. M. Stewart, Col. requesting that City of Lufkin, Texas, grant him ~~an~~ A License to operate Taxi in City of Lufkin, Texas, since it had already been properly advertised in local newspaper, as required by law. The motion was made by W. D. Winston, and seconded by J. E. May, that License be granted upon payment of the usual Taxi License Fee. The Mayor put the question to a vote--all voted "AYE". "NOES"-None.

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6. Mr. Stine said he had looked over the road from the Huntington Highway near two-point around by the 2nd Baptist Church--connecting with Lufkin Avenue, and that it would cost about \$600.00 to grub trees and widen it so two cars could pass each other. Council Advised City Manager to see County Commissioner's Court and see if they would assist in fixing this road.

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7. There being no further business to come before the meeting, on motion duly made and carried, it adjourned.

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8. The above and foregoing minutes read and approved on this the 3rd day of October A.D. 1939.
