Foundry Street and other streets and avenues in City of Lufkin, and assessing a part of costs of such improvements on said streets and avenues against abutting property and owners thereof, and providing for notice of hearing. Due to time limit involved, City Manager recommended that Ordinance be approved on first and second reading at this meeting. Commissioner W.C. Royle moved that same be passed on first reading, seconded by Commissioner H.E. Rowin and unanimous vote given. Commissioner H.E. Rowin then made motion that same be passed on second and final reading. Commissioner Bayo Hopper seconded motion and vote was unanimous.

7. City Attorney presented application for zone change from "B" to "F" District, covering Lots 1 and 2, Block 82, Original townsite of Lufkin, Texas, for hearing in meeting on September 1, 1959, by John S. Redditt and Mrs. I. D. Fairchild. Said application has been approved by Zoning Board and check in the amount of \$25.00 by John Winston accompanied application. Commissioner H.E. Rowin moved that same be ordered published for hearing in meeting of September 1, 1959, seconded by Commissioner Bayo Hopper and unanimous vote followed.
8. City Attorney read resolution authorizing Mayor to execute deed on the part of City of Lufkin, covering exchange of 15 acres of land to A. B. Youngblood for 4.42 acres of land. This is in accordance with agreement worked out by City Manager in connection with Sewer Improvement Program and previously approved by Commission. Commissioner W.C. Royle made motion that Resolution be passed. Motion seconded by Commissioner Bayo Hopper and voted unanimously.
9. Mayor Jim Waters read letter from Mr. R.W. Wortham, Jr., President of Forest Capital Broadcasting Company, advising that Federal Communication Commission had approved application for construction permit for microwave installation for use with community antenna system which will be operated by Vumore Co. of Lufkin. Mr. Wortham further stated that construction work will start within next few days. Commission members were highly pleased with this information.
10. Open Items were gone over and discussed.
11. There being no further business for consideration, the meeting adjourned.
