MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS, HELD October 16, 1956, AT 7:30 P.M.

in regular session, in the regular meeting place in

- 1. The meeting was opened with prayer by Mayor Woodrow W. Scott.
- 2. The minutes of the regular meeting of October 2, were read and approved.
- 3. A committee, with John Hensley, as spokesman, appeared before the Commission and requested that the City take no action relative to the improvements of the City Lake property until the next regular meeting to be held on November 6. Also a letter was read from John S. Reddit relative to certain improvements at Jones Lake and the City Lake. Action on his request was likewise post-poned until the next regular meeting.
- 4. Norris Gipson came before the Commission and discussed damages he claims to have sustained by reason of the laying of and additional water line through his property. After much discussion, it was agreed to arbitrate the differences in the event the matter was not settled between Mr. Gipson and the City.
- 5. Dan Shull, representing H. H. Null Pipe Line Contractor, presented a letter requesting thirty days extention of time in which to complete the installation of the water line. He stated the delay was due to the inability of his company to receive the pipe on time.
- 6. The City Commission agreed to allow its fire fighting equipment to go to the new radar station near Clawson, in the event of fire, provided such equipment was not in use within the corporate limits of the City.

7. Bob Johnson of the engineering firm of Freese, Nichols & Turner submitted plans and specifications for bids to be advertised on additional water lines, such bids to be opened on November 6, 1956.

8. The Commission authorized the purchasing of two 400 gallon

capacity pumps for two lift stations.
9. Bills of the month of September were approved and ordered

paid.
10. There being no further business to come before the Commission, the meeting adjourned.
