Burke, M.C.Spivey and W.A.Abney. Against,- None.

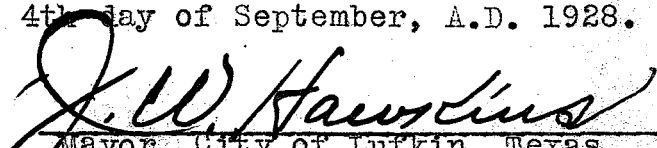
ORDINANCE CHANGING NAME OF NOBLE AVENUE TO DOUGLASS STREET:

MINUTES OF A CALL MEETING OF THE
CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF
LUFKIN, TEXAS, HELD SEPT.
7th. 1928.

Be it remembered that on this the 7th day of September, A.D.1928, there was begun and holden a call meeting of the City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas, at the City Hall in said City; Present and presiding the following officers of the City, to-wit:- J.W.Hawkins, Mayor, M.C..Spivey, Commissioner of Ward No. 3, W.A.Abney, Commissioner of Ward No. 4, V.R.Smitham, City Manager, W. O. Seale, City Attorney and T. L. Dunn, City Secretary, when the following proceedings were had, to-wit:

The Mayor announced that the purpose of the meeting was to discuss the matter of procuring right-of-way through what is known as the North Railroad Reservation, and particularly lots 5, 6, 7 and 8 of said block of land, being property owned by the Flournoy heirs and the Shotwell estate.

After a thorough discussion of the matter the City Manager reported that he had reached an agreement with the Shotwell heirs whereby if the City purchased the lots belonging to the Flournoy Heirs a deed would be made to the Shotwell heirs for the unused part of lots 5 and 6 on the North side of Culverhouse Street and that part of said lots on the South Side of said Culverhouse Street to be deeded to L.S. Atkins, in each case the property owners to pay paving assessments on the entire frontage of their respective sides. It being agreed that the City assume the paving assessment on thirty-one front feet on Culverhouse Street, this being the frontage of a small triangle which was cut off of the joint railroad property by the extension of Cain Street to intersect with Culverhouse Street. It also being agreed that said triangle would be deeded to the City by the Railroad Companies, and the city in turn would deed same to the Shotwell heirs. After having heard the report of the City Manager, it was moved by M.C.Spivy and seconded by W.A.Abney that such agreement be made and confirmed. *and that the Mayor be and is hereby authorized to execute said* Said motion carried unanimously.
