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CALL MEETING OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY
OF LUFKIN, TEXAS, OCTOBER 15, A. D. 1929.

CITY OF LUFKIN On this the 15th day of October, A. D. 1929,
the City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas convened in special
session in the commission room of the City Hall with the following
members present, viz:

Joe C. Denman, Mayor;
C. E. Brazil, Commissioner Ward No. 1;
C. A. Burke, Commissioner Ward No. 2;
R. C. Jordan, Commissioner Ward No. 3;
W. A. Abney, Commissioner Ward No. 4; and
W. D. Tiner, City Manager;
T. L. Dunn, City Secretary;
W. O. Seale, City Attorney;

when the following proceedings were had, to-wit:

The Mayor stated the purpose of the meeting was to receive
bids for the erection of a galvanized, corrugated iron warehouse,
size 50 by 60 feet, one story in height, and such other matters
as might properly come before the commission. And the following
sealed bids were received and opened:

W. A. Foster, Lufkin, Texas;	\$1657.20;
Atkinson & Cox, Lufkin, Texas;	\$1925.00;
Loden & Slack, Lufkin, Texas;	\$1484.00;

After discussing of the bids received, and on recommendation
of City Manager, W. D. Tiner, it was moved by R. C. Jordan and
seconded by C. A. Burke that the bid of Loden & Slack of Lufkin,
Texas, being the lowest secured bid, be accepted, the motion was put
by Mayor Joe C. Denman, to accept the bid of Loden & Slack, all
members of the City Commission, viz: Joe C. Denman, C. E. Brazil,
C. A. Burke, R. C. Jordan and W. A. Abney, voting "Yea", the bid
of Loden & Slack was accepted.

And, on motion of R. C. Jordan, seconded by C. A. Burke, all
commissioners voting yea, the Mayor, Joe C. Denman, be and he is
hereby ordered and directed to execute a contract in the name of the
City of Lufkin, Texas, with the said Loden & Slack, a copartnership
composed of W. W. Loden and A. C. Slack, for the construction of the
galvanized iron warehouse for the City of Lufkin at the price of
\$1484.00; and which said contract shall be attested by the Secretary

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and the corporate seal affixed thereto.

The above and foregoing minutes were

The matter of constructing a two inch galvanized water line on the South side of Denman Avenue connecting with water mains on Conn Avenue and South First Street was thoroughly discussed, after which, it was moved by R. C. Jordan and seconded by W.A. Abney that the City Manager be and he is hereby authorized to construct such water line. The motion carried unanimously.

The paving contractor, Scott Shambaugh, having reported the completion of the following streets, to-wit:- The three projects on Lake Street, and one project on Bynum Street, a description of which is fully set out in ordinance at another page of these minutes, and the City Engineer, J.B. Woiton having recommended in writing the acceptance of same, on motion by C.A. Burke seconded by W.A. Abney said streets are hereby accepted.

A number of citizens living on Lufkin Avenue between fourth street and Shepherd Avenue intersection with said Lufkin Avenue appeared before the City Commission and asked that a storm sewer be built at the entire cost of the City, parallel with said Lufkin and on the North side of same from said 4th street to Shepherd Ave. The matter having been duly considered by the City Commission it was unanimously decided that same could not be built at this time.

An order heretofore made requiring all persons and firms who install gas appliance of any kind to make bond and take out license for such work, was rescinded by order of the Commission. All that is hereafter required is that such installations be reported to the City Manager's Office for inspection, which said inspection shall be free, provided same is found to be in accordance with the City ordinance governing such installations, but that if a second inspection is required on the same job a fee of \$1.00 shall be charged for such second inspection.

There being no further business to come before the meeting, on motion duly made and carried same adjourned.

OF THE CITY OF LUTKIN HELD OCTOBER 15, A. D. 1929.

Be it remembered that on this the 15th day of October A. D. 1929, there was begun and holden a regular meeting of the City Commission of the City of Lutkin, Texas, at the Municipal Hall thereof with the following members present, to-wit:

and when among other matters the following proceedings were had, to-wit:

It appearing to the City Commission that portions of four streets and one alley, viz:

(1) Lake Street from its intersection with E. B. line of Abney Avenue to East line of Lot 9, Abney Addition;

(2) Lake Street beginning at a point where the east line of Lot 9, Abney Addition intersects Lake Street, same being about 80 ft. N.E. from the intersection of Lake Street with Abney Avenue, to the East line of Lot 1, Block 1, E. & W. Shop Addition;

(3) Lake Street from S. line of Block 1, Lot 1, E. & W. Shop Addition to the N. Line of E. & W. Shop Addition;

(4) Bynum Street from its intersection with the S. line of Kiln Avenue southwardly to S. E. corner of N. D. Wright's homestead tract; and

(5) Alley in Block 5, original townsite, from the W. line of South First Street to E. line of Angelina Avenue;

have been completed according to contract for street paving with Scott Shambaugh of Houston, Texas, of date July 2nd, 1929 A. D., and the acceptance of said streets and alley has been recommened in writing by City Engineer, J. B. Woiten; on motion of R. C. Jordan, seconded by W. A. Abney, all voting yea, said streets and alley were accepted from Scott Shambaugh, paving contractor, and said improvement on said streets and alley is now received and accepted by the City.

The Mayor and City Secretary are hereby authorized and directed to issue improvement assessment certificates therefor in accordance with the assessments ordinance passed heretofore.
