1. Minutes of March 4th meeting approved, motion Commissioner Snell, second Commissioner Treadwell.

2. Zone change as requested by Mrs. R. A. Courtney approved to be advertised on motion of Commissioner Zeagler, second by Commissioner Snell.

3. Zone change as requested by M. E. and Finis Gibbs approved to be advertised on motion of Commissioner Snell, second by Commissioner Zeagler.

4. Mrs. Joe Tilly complained that the City was encroaching on her property for street purposes in the grading of an unnamed street between the Townsend Addition and the Kornegay Tract on the East side of Chestnut. The Commission agreed to regrade the street to its 20 ft. width.

5. A petition by a Mr. Scarbrough of Nacogdoches for the operation of a receiving, amplifying, and transmitting of television signals by cable was discussed, but action was delayed until a later date.


6. An ordinance regulating the sale of water outside the City limits was passed on first reading on motion of Commissioner Snell, second by Commissioner Zeagler; the ordinance was passed on second reading on motion of Commissioner Zeagler, second by Commissioner Snell.

7. The 1951 audit was granted to Axley and Rode on the basis of their bid.


8. On motion of Commissioner Snell, second by Commissioner Zeagler, the salary of the City Secretary was raised to \$375.00 per month.

9. The 1952 budget as presented by the City Manager was approved on motion of Commissioner Snell, second by Commissioner Zeagler.
