MINUTES OF A CALL MEETING
OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE
CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS,
HELD March 8th, 1932.

Be it remembered that on this the 8th day of March, A. D. 1932,
there was begun and holden a call meeting of the City Commission of
the City of Lufkin, Texas, at the Municipal Office in said City, with
the following officers of the City present and presiding, to-wit:-

The following proceedings were had, to-wit:-

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The purpose of the meeting was to discuss matters relating to
preparations for general work in the City departments preparatory
to the coming of the Chamber of Commerce Meeting to be held in the
City about the middle of April, 1932, and to do and perform any other
business that might properly come before the meeting.

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K. W. Denman, chairman of a Committee from the local Chamber of
Commerce appeared before the City Commission and urged that a general
clean up of the City be had and that the old paved streets be patched.
The City Commission promised full co-operation with the Chamber of
Commerce in such a move.

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Mrs. Eva Sharpe, Chairman of a Committee from the Community Chest
and made an appeal to the City Commission for a contribution of \$1,000.00
to be used in the relief of unemployment. Action was deferred until
the first Tuesday in April, the date for the regular meeting of the said
City Commission.

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Jno. S. Redditt, President of the Lufkin Library Board appeared
before the City Commission with reference to securing deed or lease
from the City to the plat of land known as Cotton Square on which to
erect a Library Building. He also discussed the question of the City
setting up in its next budget an item of \$100.00 per month for the
purpose of maintenance of said library. W. A. Abney made a motion and
M. M. Jones seconded same that said plat of ground be leased to Angelina
County Library Association for a period of ninety-nine years, with the
usual reversionary clause incorporated in said lease. The motion car-

ried unanimously, and Mr. Reddit was authorized to draw a lease and submit same to R.C. Musslewhite, City Attorney, for approval and recommendation to the City Commission.

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C. A. Burke made a motion which was seconded by W. A. Abney, that the sum of \$100.00 per month be set up in the next annual budget of the City to be used as a maintenance for the Library, such amount to begin paying when the Library building is completed and put in operation. The motion carried unanimously.

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A Committee of Dairymen appeared before the City Commission and demanded the passage of an Ordinance or an amendment to the Present Milk Ordinance, prohibiting the same within the City limits of the City of Lufkin only Grade "A" milk as applies to raw milk. The City Commission not being conversant with the general conditions etc as now applies to the milk business in the City, it was suggested that the dairymen get with Mr. R.C. Musslewhite, City Attorney, and prepare an ordinance for submission to the City Commission at some future meeting of said City Commission. Such suggestion was agreed upon by the visiting dairymen.

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Accounts and bills due by the city to various parties, firms and corporations were presented for payment and it appearing that such of said bills as had been properly approved for payment by the City Manager should be paid, on motion duly made and carried same were allowed.

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There being no further business to come before the meeting, on motion duly made and carried, same adjourned.
