The object of the meeting as explained by Mayor Pro Tempore Deemorgan being to canvass the returns of the recent special election for Mayor, administer the oath of office to Mayor elect McMullen and attend to such other business as may prove before the meeting.

After carefully canvassing the vote as returned by the presiding judge of said election held on June 10th 1913 the Council found there were cast in said election a total of 119 votes and the following named persons received the number of votes set opposite their names for their office of Mayor of the City of Lufkin: W. R. McMullen 76 votes, R. B. Shearer 40 votes - W. A. Deemorgan 1 vote -

Ry Co a motion was made by Alderman Campbell seconded by Alderman Roach all Aldermen voting aye that the Secretary be instructed to ask DuPh. Walker of said road to give this city relief from such offense
