MINUTES OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN TEXAS,
May 2nd. 1916.

The City Council of the City of Lufkin, Texas met in regular session on this the 2nd. day of May A.D. 1916 in the Council Chamber of Said City there being present the following Officers and Members, to wit:

Aldermen, Price, Behanon, Fairchilds, Davis and Hawthorne.
E. A. Perkins, Sanitary Inspector, G. A. Medford, Assessor and Collector and H. B. Satterfield, Secretary.

Mayor Mantooth being absent on account of sickness, the meeting was called to order by Mayor-Protem Davis.

The meeting was opened by prayer by Mayor-Protem Davis.
Secretary read minutes of meetings of April 4th. and 6th. and were approved by the unanimous vote of the Council.

Report of Street Commissioner approved.

Report of Poundmaster approved.

After some discussion, it was moved by Alderman Hawthorne, which motion was seconded by Alderman Price that the City Attorney be and he is hereby instructed to draft an ordinance providing for the commitment and working on streets of all City prisoners. Motion carried by the unanimous vote of the Council.

Report of Tax Assessor and Collector approved.

Report of the Corporation Court blank.

Mr. W. S. Rags and others appeared before the Council in reference to improvements on Pole and Bond Avenues. They asked that the City construct cross street sidewalks across the above named streets, they having paved the sidewalks in front of their properties. After some discussion, it was moved by Alderman Price and seconded by Alderman Hawthorne that the City construct cross walks as above described when Mr. Bond had surrendered a deed to the City Secretary deeding the above streets to the City. On being put to a vote, all Aldermen voting AYE.

Mr. J. S. Moore and others presented a petition to the Council praying that the City make proper improvements on their streets which were then in a very bad condition. It was moved by Alderman Price and seconded by Alderman Behanon that the petition be referred to the Street and Alley Committee. All voting AYE.

Alderman Fairchilds representing himself and the Largent Estate asked that the Council grant them an extension of 60 days on the tie for paving in front of their property on Lufkin Avenue. All voting AYE.

Alderman Fairchilds offered an ordinance describing the meets and bounds of the City of Lufkin, Texas, and establishing the limits of the new incorporation of the City of Lufkin, Texas. It was therefore moved by Alderman Price and seconded by Alderman Behanon that the ordinance be adopted as read and designated as Ordinance No. 130. All Aldermen voting Aye.

Messrs G. W. Largent and J. E. Davis were duly installed as Aldermen of the City of Lufkin and who were elected to that Office at the regular election of April 4th. 1916.

There being no further business to come before the Council, it was moved and seconded that the meeting be adjourned until May 10th. A.D. 1916 at 8 P.M. at which time the Council would complete the business now before it. All Aldermen voting AYE.
