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MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING OF THE CITY COMMISSION
OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS, HELD February 4,
1941 AT 7:30 P. M.

On this the 4th day of February, A. D. 1941, the City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas convened in regular session, in the regular meeting place in said City, with the following members thereof, to-wit:

being present, and the following absent: J. W. LEWIS, constituting a quorum when the following business was transacted:

1. Minutes of all preceding meetings were read, approved and adopted.

2. John W. Laird was present in behalf of Frank Lee Austin requesting transfer of taxi permits 8 and 9 from D. C. Cook. On the basis of written transfer of D. C. Cook, G. E. Barington moved that the transfer be allowed; seconded by W. D. Winston, Jr., all commissioners voting Ay.

3. Mr. Sam Townsend, Sr. Appeared in regard to his taxes. He wanted to sell the city two lots and apply on the taxes, or to apply the rent from his fruit stand to his taxes. The reason he made these offers was to put off a tax suit which was about to be filed. No action was taken.

4. Mr. John Wilson and other citizens of Oakgrove Addition appeared with reference to sewer connections in Oakgrove. The Council passed the matter pending an investigation of the cost and feasibility of a lift station.

5. Mr. G. W. Legg requested that his rendition be adjusted because of an error made in rendering in that the house rendered was

not started until after the first of the year. By a unanimous vote the council adjusted the rendition.

6. The Walker Wholesale Grocery rendition was adjusted because of an error in inventory.

7. Mr. Stine read the report of the Fire Department for the year 1940 and the streets to be placed in the second paving project were approved. The Forest Committee recommended the expenditure of \$3,300.00 out of our next year's budget for the improvement of the property around the City Lake. Mr. Stine was of the opinion that this expense could be cut in half and the Council was of the opinion that they did not want to put a bath house or allowing bathing in the City Lake and decided that they wanted to carry on the work but decided to keep the cost down so as not to exceed the present park budget estimate. Mr. D. W. Thompson was named as an additional member of the Community Forest Committee.

8. Mr. G. A. Richardson, City Treasurer, tendered his resignation and it was accepted. Upon motion of W. D. Winston, Jr., seconded by J. E. Jay, Mr. C. B. Richardson was appointed treasurer of the City of Lufkin, all commissioners present voting AYE.

There being no further business to come before the meeting, it was upon motion, duly made and carried, adjourned.
