MINUTES OF CALLED MEETING OF THE
CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS,
HELD MAY 17th. 1927.

Be it remembered that on this the 17th day of June, A.D. 1927,
there was begun and holden a call meeting of the City Commission of the
City of Lufkin, Texas, at the Municipal Office thereof in said City;
Present and presiding the following officers of the City, to-wit: J.W.
Hawkins, Mayor, Joe C. Denman, Commissioner of Ward No. 1, A.M. Walker,
Commissioner of Ward No. 2, M. C. Spivey, Commissioner of Ward No. 3,
E. W. Leach, Commissioner of Ward No. 4, V. R. Smitham, City Manager,
W. O. Seale, City Attorney and T. L. Dunn, City Secretary, when the
following proceedings were had, to-wit:--

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The Mayor announced that the purpose of the meeting was to dis-
the calling
cuss and possibly call an election for the purpose of amending the
City charter relating to the tax rate of said City. The matter was
discussed at length, after which it was decided to await the calling
of an election for the purpose named until a petition with the re-
quired number of signatures was presented asking that such an elec-
tion be had.

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The question as to whether or not the north half of Block No.
11 of the City of Lufkin, Texas, should be included in the brick
fire limits of the City was discussed, but no action was taken in
regard to same.

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V.R. Smitham, City Manager presented his expense account for at-
tending Convention of City Managers and League of Texas Municipalities,
at San Angelo, and asked that same be allowed. On motion made by Joe
C. Denman, seconded by A.M. Walker, it was unanimously carried that
same be allowed.

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AN ORDINANCE to regulate the laying, construction, building, re-
pairing and rebuilding of sidewalks, curbs, and curbs and gutters on
the streets, alleys and thoroughfares of the City of Lufkin, was pre-
sented for passage and approval on second reading. After discussion
of same it was moved by A.M. Walker and seconded by M.C. Spivey that
said ordinance be placed on second reading and that same be finally
passed on second reading. The mayor put the question, requesting all
members who favored said motion and the final passage on second reading
of said ordinance to vote Aye and there appeared to vote Aye the

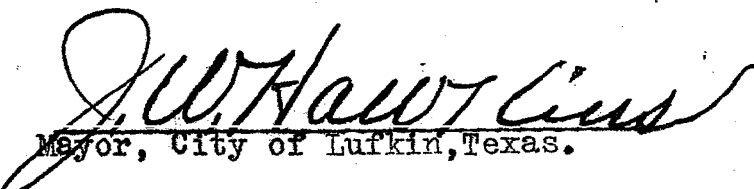
following members voted "Aye" J.W.Hawkins, Joe C.Denman, A.M.Walker, M.C. Spivey and E.W.Leach. The following members voted "No"— None. Whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried and the ordinance finally passed on second reading.

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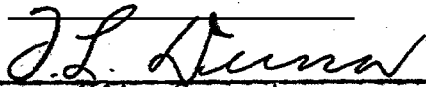
There being no further business to come before the meeting, on motion duly made and carried same adjourned.
