MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING OF
THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF
LUFKIN, TEXAS, HELD OCT. 4th.
1927.

Be it remembered that on this the 4th day of October, A.D. 1927, there was begun and holden a regular meeting of the City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas, at the Municipal Office thereof in said City. There were present and presiding the following officers, to-wit: J. W. Hawkins, Mayor, Joe C. Denman, Commissioner of Ward No. 1, A. M. Walker, Commissioner of Ward No. 2, M. C. Spivey, Commissioner of Ward No. 3, E. W. Leach, Commissioner of Ward No. 4, V. R. Smitham, City Manager, W. O. Seale, City Manager and T. L. Dunn, City Secretary, when the following proceedings were had, to-wit:-

Minutes of former meetings read and on motion duly made and carried were appreved as read.

Dr. L. T. Tinkle, City Health Officer appeared before the City Commission and recommended the passage of necessary ordinance to give to the citizens of Lufkin Grade "A" milk. After discussion of the subject the City Manager was instructed to write to other cities having ordinances controlling the dispensing of milk in order that our city might profit by having such information.

It appearing that it was necessary to borrow \$6,000.00 for general purposes, on motion made by M.C. Spivey and seconded by E.W. Leach, the Mayor was authorized to execute necessary note for the purpose of securing said loan. The Motion carried unanimously.

The matter of sewer rate to be granted to the Bonner Hotel was discussed, after which on motion by A.M. Walker and seconded by Joe C. Denman, it was unanimously carried that the Bonner Hotel et als a 60% reduction based on the original rates.

W. F. Roberts, Harry Kerr and H. B. Satterfield appeared before the City Commission and requested and urged that the New Fire Station to be built soon, be built on the site of the old station. After much discussion of the subject, it was moved by Joe C. Denman and seconded by A. M. Walker that the new station be built at the site of the

site of the old station. The mayor having put the question on said motion requested those who favored same to vote "AYE" and those who opposed same to vote "NO"— The following members voted "AYE"— Joe C. Denman and A. M. Walker. The following members voted "NO"— J.W.Hawkins, M. C. Spivey and E. W. Leach. Whereupon the Mayor declared the motion defeated.

There came up for discussion the question of the passage of a "One Hour Parking Ordinance" on First Street from Post Office to Cotton Belt Depot and from Cotton Square to 2nd street. After considering same, it was moved by E. W. Leach and seconded by Joe C. Denman that such ordinance be passed. The mayor put the question and said motion was defeated by the following Vote: "AYE" E. W. Leach, and Joe C. Denman, "NO"— J.W.Hawkins, A.M.Walker and M.C.Spivey.

The City Tax rolls for the year 1927 were presented for examination and approval, and on motion made by Joe C. Denman seconded by A.M.Walker, which carried unanimously, said rolls were approved.

E. W. Leach and Joe C. Denman were appointed by the Mayor as a committee to locate site for new fire station.

City Manager was authorized to sell old triplex pump and electric motor operating same.

Accounts and bills were presented for payment and on motion duly made and carried were allowed.

There being no further business to come before the meeting on motion duly made and carried same adjourned.
