

94 Lufkin, Texas, April 23rd. 1915.

Be it remembered that on this the 23rd. day of April A.D. 1915 there came on and was held a "Special Called Session" of the Honorable City Council of the City of Lufkin, Texas in the Council Chambers of said City, there being present

The minutes of the previous meeting, April 20th. 1915 were read and and after making the following corrections were approved.

First correction, "Striking out that portion of same reading that Mayor Mantooth was appointed Ex-Officio Water Commissioner"

Second correction, " Adding to that portion of the Minutes where-in Mayor Mantooth was appointed Ex-officio Street Commissioner that, Alderman Davis acted as Mayor Pro-Tem"

In the order of business, the following were had to-wit:-

By virtue of power vested in him, Mayor Mantooth made the following appointments all of which were confirmed by a unanimous vote of the Council. City Health Officer, Dr. W. B. Treadwell, Clerk Corporation Court, H.B. Satterfield, Sanitary Inspector, E. A. Perkins.

Also by virtue of power vested in him, Mayor Mantooth appointed the following committees. Water and Lights Committee, I. D. Fairchilds and S.W.Hawthorne. Finance Committee, W. D. Price, J. F. Davis. Committee on Police and Fire Regulations, T. A. Behanon, S. W. Hawthorne and I.D.Fairchild.

Mr. G. T. Cross of the Angleina County Progressive League addressed the Council in behalf of the Philip A. Ryan Lumber Company and requested that the City provide fire protection as promised by the past Council and offered the suggestion that the City lay a 4" main connecting with their main at a point near the Lufkin Steam Bottling Works, corssing the H.E.&W.T.Ry. Company tracks and connect with the Main of the Cotton Belt Ry. Co. at a point near thier turn table. This pipe to be used only in case of emergency, to which arrangement the Cotton Belt has given their consent, the papers being presented to the Council for their inspection. It was moved by Alderman Fairchild and seconded by Alderman Price that the City lay the 4" main as per Mr. Cross's suggestion. All Aldermen voting "Aye". It was further moved by Alderman Price, seconded by Alderman Fairchilds that Mayor Mantooth, Engineer McCarthy and Alderman Davis be instructed to investigate the various funds in order to provide for the laying of the 4" pipe as above ~~xxx~~ mentioned for the Philip A. Ryan Lbr. Company. All Aldermen voted "Aye".

Mr. W. R. McMullen, representing the W. P. Berry & Company Contractors, asked the Council to return to his Company their proposal and certified check covering the repairs for the waste-way of the New City Pond where-up-on it was moved and seconded that the City Engineer return the said Proposal and Certified Check to the W.P.Berry & Company and that the Secretary furnish the City Engineer a certified copy of these minutes. ~~xx the~~ All Aldermen voted "Aye" and the City Engineer is here-by instructed to return said Proposal and Certified Check and Secretary is here-by instructed to furnish a copy of these minutes to the City Engineer.

It is moved by Alderman Price and seconded by Alderman Hawthorne that grievance of Mr. McElroy be referred to the Street and Alley Committee. All aldermen voting "Aye"

It is also moved by Alderman Price and seconded by Alderman Hawthorne that the letter of Sam H. Kerr and Others with reference to the laying of the 4" pipe main on South Raguet Street be referred to the Water and Lights Committee. All Aldermen voted "Aye".

It is further moved by Alderman Price and seconded by Alderman Hawthorne that the letter of Mr. W. C. Trout with reference to drainage on South Raguet Street be referred to the Street and Alley Committee and all A

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It was moved by Alderman Davis and seconded by Alderman Fairchild all Aldermen voting "Aye" that Mayor Mantooth be made Ex-officio Water Commissioner. It was further moved by Alderman Price Seconded by Alderman Hawthorne that Mayor Mantooth be made Ex-officio Street Commissioner. Alderman Davis acting Mayor pro tem

It was moved and seconded, all Aldermen voting "Aye" that Mayor Mantooth appoint a committee of three to look after the streets, where-up-on he appointed Aldermen, Davis, Behanon and Fairchilds.

It was moved and seconded, all Aldermen voting "Aye", that Mayor Mantooth appoint a Committee to check up the report and the Inventory of Water Commissioner Gray, where-up-on he appointed Aldermen Price and Davis and Secretary Satterfield.

All Councilmen were instructed to meet at office of the Lufkin Plumbing Company at 1 P.M. Wednesday 21st. to be taken on a tour of inspection by Water Commissioner Gray.

After considerable discussion, it was moved and seconded all Aldermen voting "Aye" that the abolition of the Office of Deputy Night City Marshall be postponed until next meeting night.

Having disposed of the most important business, it was moved and seconded that the Council adjourn until Friday night April 23rd. 1915.
