

MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING OF THE CITY COMMISSION  
OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS, HELD NOVEMBER 19th,  
1957, at 7:30 P. M.

On this the 19th day of November, A. D., 1957,  
the City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas, convened in  
regular session, in the regular meeting place in said  
City, with the following members thereof, towit:

constituting a quorum when  
the following business was transacted:

1. The meeting was opened with prayer by the Mayor, S.R. Parker, Jr.
2. The Minutes of the Regular Meeting of November 5th, were read and approved.
3. J.A. Lawrence appeared before the Commission and complained that his water bills for the past three (3) months had been too high. He was advised that the City would take out the meter, test it, and if it was found that the reading of the meter was erroneous, or if the meter failed to register properly, an adjustment would be made.
4. As previously advertised, bids were opened on two (2) billing machines. Burroughs Corporation, and the Underwood Corporation submitted bids. Such bids were held over, so they could be tabulated, and at the next meeting, contracts of purchase would be awarded to the lowest and best bidder.

Bids were also opened for the purchase of an Addressing Machine, and an Embossing Machine. The bid of Addressograph-Multigraph Sales Agencies was the only bid submitted. The City Manager recommended that such bids be accepted, but it was suggested that he contact the Company telling it that there was only a certain amount set up in the budget for the purchase of such machines, and see if they would not meet such price.

5. Bob Johnson of the engineering firm, Freese, Nichols & Turner, gave a comprehensive report on the needs of the sewer treatment plant and the sewer lines in the City. He gave a detailed report on the needs of the sewer system, at the present time, and for the future. It was agreed that the City would study his report and suggestions of the sewer system.

6. Bob Day of the bond~~ing~~ firm of Raucher-Pierce Company, discussed Sewer Revenue Bonds with the City and recommended, if the City decided to vote such bonds, that it vote the maximum amount, and sell them as needed.

7. The Commission approved the payment of the monthly statement of Freese, Nichols & Turner for the month of October, in the sum of \$1169.21.

8. A committee was appointed consisting of Lynn Metteauer, W.C. Royle, and L.C. Brittain to make a study of the property located at the intersection of Vann Street and Lufkin Avenue.


9. The City Manager was given permission to remove the rock pillars at the intersection of Feagin Drive and Pershing Avenue, such pillars being considered a traffic hazard.

10. The Commission voted to install traffic signals at the intersection of Angelina and Denman Streets.

11. The one-way ordinance, regulating traffic on certain streets in the City was passed on first reading.


12. Bills for the month of October were approved and ordered paid.
