

The City Council of the City of Lufkin Texas met on this the 11th day of March 1918 at 7.30 pm with the following named officers present K. Morgan mayor presiding, W.D. Price, W.D. Newsome and S.W. Hawthorne aldermen and R.P. Walker secretary when the following orders were made

It is ordered by the council that the verbal resignation of O.C. Stewart as Deputy marshal and pound master of the city of Lufkin Texas be accepted.

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It is ordered by the council that the appointment of Edgar Brown to the office of Deputy marshal and pound master of the city of Lufkin Texas by K. Morgan mayor be and the same is hereby confirmed.

It is ordered that the secretary write H Mueller Mfg Co. and the Peden Iron & Steel Co. for an itemized statement of their accounts with the city of Lufkin Texas.

After some discussion as to raising funds to pay for boring a well to increase the city water supply the council adjourned to meet again on March the 12th 1918 at 7 o'clock P.M. for the purpose of closing contract for the loan of money to bore a well for the city of Lufkin Texas

The City Council of the City of Lufkin Texas met in regular adjourned session on this the 12th day of March 1918 at 7 o'clock P.M. with the following named officers present; K Morgan mayor presiding, S. W. Hawthorne W. D. Newsom and W. D. Price, alderman and R. P. Walker Secretary
The object of the meeting being to close

Contracts with The Lufkin Land and Lumber, The Lufkin Ice plant, The Electric Light & power Co. And The Lufkin Foundry & Machine Co for the loan of money by said Corporation to the City of Lufkin Texas to pay for boring or sinking a well for the said City of Lufkin Texas to secure a more adequate supply of water for said City and said Contracts and resolutions having been presented by Judge E. J. Mantooth, Attorney for the above named Corporation, To wit: The Lufkin Land & Lumber Company, The Lufkin Ice plant company, The Lufkin Electric Light & power Co., And The Lufkin Foundry and Machine Co. And said Resolutions and Contracts having been duly considered by the Council it was moved and seconded and so ordered by the Council That said Resolution and Contracts be adopted and approved in order as follows;

"Whereas The City of Lufkin has
 " practically exhausted their present supply of
 " water and whereas they have no money with
 " which to purchase additional machinery, or
 " additional water power, or to build enlarge
 " or extend, or repair their water system in
 " order to secure an additional supply of water and
 " Whereas, it is necessary and an emergency

" exists for an additional supply of water
 " and to do so it is necessary to sink a well
 " or wells in order to secure a sufficient supply
 " of water for the immediate demands of the city,
 " Therefore be it resolved that the City of Lufkin
 " is hereby authorized to borrow from the
 " Lufkin Land & Lumber Company not more
 " than Five Thousand Dollars in cash and to
 " execute all obligations necessary for that
 " purpose including the mortgaging of the
 " water plant including all machinery and
 " apparatus of every kind and description and
 " the land upon which it is situated to secure the
 " payment of the Five Thousand Dollars which
 " indebtedness shall bear interest not to exceed
 " six per cent per annum, interest payable
 " annually as it matures.
 " The payment of said sum of money is to be
 " made on the part of the City of Lufkin by
 " furnishing to the Lufkin Land & Lumber
 " Company such supply of water for use in
 " the operation of its saw mill plant situated
 " contiguous to the town of Lufkin as may
 " be demanded from time to time by the
 " Lufkin Land & Lumber Company for such
 " price and rate for water as is now being
 " charged and maintained by the City of Lufkin
 " to the Lufkin Land & Lumber Company and to
 " other patrons of the City of Lufkin in
 " procuring the necessary supply of water,
 " provided that if the Lufkin Land & Lumber
 " Company should not need sufficient

" water to discharge this obligation during the
 " period of the operation of its mill plant as now
 " situated in the town of Lufkin then the city of
 " Lufkin is to pay off and discharge said obli-
 " gation in cash with accrued interest thereon
 " as may be provided in such contract, and
 " K. Morgan, the mayor of said city is hereby
 " authorized to sign said contract as mayor
 " and to be attested by the Secretary under the
 " hand and seal of the City of Lufkin, which
 " resolution was submitted to the City Council
 " in regular session all members of the
 " City Council being present for their
 " ratification which resolution was
 " unanimously adopted by the city
 " Council by each member thereof voting
 " as follows;

" W. D. Price voting aye

" W. D. Newsom voting aye

" S. W. Hawthorne voting aye

" K. Morgan voting aye

" which resolution is authorized to be
