The following proceedings were had, to-wit:-

The purpose of the meeting as stated by the Mayor was to de-
clare the result of the recent general city election which was held
on the 7th of April, and to^{do} and perform any other business that might
properly come before the meeting.

An ordinance declaring the result of said city election was pre-
sented for passage and approval, whereupon after same was read to the
City Commission it was moved by Commissioner C.A. Burke and seconded
by Commissioner W.A. Abney that said ordinance be finally passed and
approved. The Mayor put the question and the following is the recorded
vote on the adoption of said ordinance, to-wit: "Ayes"- Joe C. Denman,
W. O. Greene, C.A. Burke and W.A. Abney, "Noes" - None- The Mayor
declared the motion carried and the said ordinance finally passed and

Mr. Stedman of Houston, Texas, owner of a chain of sandwich shops
appeared in person and by attorney on a matter relating to the con-
struction of a sandwich shop building in the fire limits of the City
of Lufkin. After much discussion as to whether Mr. Stedman should be
permitted to proceed with said building as he had already begun same,
the matter was passed until City Manager Daniel would return from Dal-
las, he having heretofore had the matter up with Mr. Steadman.

A petition having been presented to the City Commission asking that the name of Pole ~~XXXXX~~ Avenue be changed, and the name "Laurel" having been suggested by said petitioners, it was moved by C. A. Burke, and seconded by W. O. Greene, that the name of Pole Avenue be changed to Laurel Avenue. The motion having been put by the Mayor the following vote is here recorded on same, to-wit: "Ayes"- W.A.Foster, C.A.Burke, W.O.Greene and W.A. Abney- "Noes" -None- Whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried and the name of Pole Avenue changed to Laureal Avenue.
