

MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING OF THE CITY COMMISSION

1956, AT 7:30 P.M.

in regular session, in the regular meeting place in

ing business was transacted:

1. The meeting was opened with a prayer by Mayor Woodrow W. Scott.
2. The minutes of the regular meeting of November 6, and the minutes of the called meeting of November 13, were read and approved.
3. R. E. L. Johnson of the Engineering firm of Freese, Nichols & Turner gave a report on the re-location of the 12" water line. He recommended a shortening of the 12" water line and the laying of additional 6" and 8" lines to take the place of the original location of the 12" line. It was suggested that the contractor look over the new location with the Engineer and then the awarding of the contract would be made, if such new location is approved.
4. Mr. Johnson also reported that the official test on the new water well meets the requirements of the contract.
4. The Commission heard a report from Mr. John Hensley relative to the City Lake Recreational Project. It was agreed that a group of citizens be designated as the Park Committee, and make a report not later than February 1, 1957, submitting their plans for financing and improving the City Lake Project.
5. It was agreed that Mr. Bob Hinson, City Engineer, and Mr. Jack Nerren would contact Mr. Buddy Griffith and work out the details of the engineering services needed.

6. C. E. Brazil, City Attorney, was authorized to contact Mr. B. W. Allbritton relative to the purchase of a lift station site on the Old Union Road.

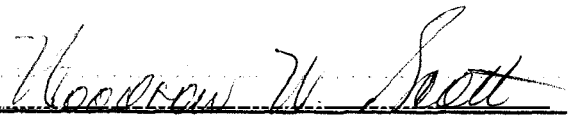
7. It was reported that 400 of the street markers had been received and Mr. Ralph Bargainer of the Street Department would begin immediately the installation of such markers.

8. Dr. Robert Taylor was re-appointed City Health Officer for two years.

9. Mayor Scott read the report from the State Health Department that the City of Lufkin's water supply had been officially approved.

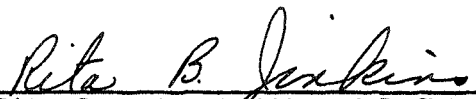
10. Bills for the month of October were read and approved.
