

MINUTES OF A SPECIAL MEETING  
OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF  
LUFKIN, TEXAS, HELD, April 23rd, 1920.

-----  
Be it remembered that on this the 23rd day of April, A.D.1920, there was held a special meeting of the City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas, at the Municipal Office thereof, in said City. Present and presiding the Hon. G. A. Kelley, Mayor, E. E. Woods and W. B. Treadwell, Commissioners, (Commissioner S.R.Parker being absent), L. Mitchell, City Manager, and T. L. Dunn, City Secretary, when the following proceedings were had, to-wit:-

Came on to be considered the returns of an election held in the City of Lufkin, Texas, on the 17th day of April, A.D.1920, for the purpose of electing a City Commissioner from Ward No. 3, to fill out the unexpired term of C. B. Edwards, resigned, and it appearing that said election was in all respects duly and legally held, and that returns of same were duly and legally made, and it further appearing from said returns that there were cast 51 votes, of which number there were cast:

For B. L. Zeagler----- 51 Votes.

It is therefore ordered by the City Commission that B. L. Zeagler, be and he is hereby declared elected as City Commissioner of Ward No. 3 in and for the City of Lufkin, Texas, and that he qualify as directed by law by taking the required oath of office.

The said B. L. Zeagler appeared and the oath of office as required by law was administered to him, and he at once entered upon the discharge of his duties.

The City Manager reported the appointment of R. L. Mayne as City Marshall of the City of Lufkin, Texas, and by unanimous vote of the City Commission, said appointment was confirmed.

The City Manager also reported the appointment, temporarily, of A. H. Dickey, as Night Marshall, permanent<sup>appointment</sup> to be made upon satisfactory evidence of his, the said Dickey's, qualifications, which said action of the City Manager was confirmed by the City Commission.

It appearing that an ordinance should be passed by the City Commission regulating the storing of gasoline within or in connection with buildings with the city of Lufkin, Texas, B. L. Zeagler made a motion

and E. E. Woods seconded same, that the City Manager be authorized and instructed to take proper steps to have drafted an ordinance as aforesaid. By a unanimous vote of the Commission said Motion carried.

It appearing that the City is without a City Treasurer, which vacancy is caused by the removal from the City of G. J. Ivy, the duly appointed and acting Treasurer, it was moved by B. L. Zeagler and seconded by E. E. Woods that the Guaranty State Bank and Trust Company, Depository for the City, be instructed to have at once some employee of said Bank designated as City Treasurer, and to execute the Bond as required heretofore. The Motion carried unanimously, and the City Secretary instructed to at once notify said Bank of this order.

The \$150,000.00 Street Bonds and the \$50,000.00 Sewer Bonds having been duly signed by the Mayor, Countersigned by the City Secretary, and Registered by the City Treasurer, by move and second duly made and carried the City Secretary was instructed to turn said bonds over to the Guaranty State Bank & Trust Company, with instructions to proceed at once in the delivery of said bonds to the purchaser of same, and to receive the proceeds thereof in behalf of the City.

There being no other business to come before the meeting, by move and second duly made and carried, adjournment was taken.
