- l. Minutes of a regular meeting held November 6, 1945, and called meetings of November 8, 1945 and November 20m 1945 and November 29, 1945, were read and approved.
- 2. Leo Bishop, Gordon Brown, Kester Denman, T. E. Epps, Braker Alexander and Charlie Malone were present in the interest of securing Taxi Cab Permits. The need for additional Taxi Cabs in the City was discussed after which the following action was taken: Upon motion of E. A. Gibbs and seconded by J.  $\breve{A}$ . Abney, the action taken at a regular meeting held October 2, 1945, refusing Elzie Nash and Roy Roberts Taxi Permits was recended. The motion carried unanimously.
- ${\it 3}_{\it c}$  Motion was made by  ${\it B}_{\it c}$  . A. Gibbs and seconded by J. A. Abney and carried by unanimous vote that all Taxi Cab Permits now pending, be granted. The motion covered the following applications: Gordon Odum and Leo Bishop----- 3 permits

Charlie Malone---- 2 permits T. E. Epps---- 6 permits Braker Alexander----- 1 permit 

- 4 Motion was made by E. A. Gibbs and seconded by J. A. Abney that no more Taxi Cab Applications be accepted for a period of six months and that from June 30, 1945 Taxi Cab Permit Fees be raised from Ten Dollars to Twenty-Five Dollars. The motion was carried unanimously.
- 5 Mr. J. T. Arrington was present and stated that it was his belief that the City owns a street running through the Haley Addition to the City of Lufkin and adjoining his property in said addition. He further stated that he wished to sell this property but could not without a deed to this street and requested that the City grant him this deed. He was told that an investigation would be made concerning the ownership of the street, and that if necessary, action would be taken.

6. Enoch Burkley was present and requested that a traffic light be placed at the intersection of Paul Avenue and Chestnutt Street. He was told that a check up on the need of a traffic light at this location would be made.

7. Upon recommendation of the Zoning Board, the following application for Zoning Changes were read, passed on first reading:  E. J. Conn portion of "F" to "G".  A. P. Upchurch portion of "E" to "F".  Colbert Woods portion of "B" to "F".
7. The application of Mrs. J. E. Wilson to change a portion of Zone to "F" was refused upon recommendation of the Zoning Board.
f, A letter from the Layne-Texas Water well concerning a new well for the City was read by the City Manager.
ho A called meeting was set for December 7, 1945, at ten A. M.
