

MINUTES OF A CALL MEETING OF
THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE
CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS, held
August, 18th, 1920.

Be it remembered that on this the 18th day of August, A. D. 1920,
there was held a call meeting of the City Commission of the City of Lufkin,
Texas, at the Municipal Office thereof; present and presiding the Hon. E.E.
Woods, Mayor Protem, (Mayor G.A. Kelley being absent), S. R. Parker, Commis-
sioner of Ward No. 1, B. L. Zeagler, Commissioner of Ward No. 3, W. B.
Treadwell, Commissioner of Ward No. 4, K. W. Denman, City Attorney, and
T. L. Dunn, City Secretary and Acting City Manager, when the following
proceedings were had, towit:*

City Attorney, K. W. Denman, is instructed to ascertain true status of
affairs
pertaining to a one acre tract of land adjoining the Old City Reservoir which
was acquired by condemnation proceedings from A. J. Vinson, and to make
report to the City Commission.

There having heretofore been created by ordinance duly passed by the
City Commission creating the office of City Inspector and Fire Marshal,
the question of appointing an officer for such position was discussed,
after which by move and second duly made and carried, W. L. Jones was
unanimously appointed to such office, with instructions to at once enter
upon the discharge of his duties.

It appearing that it is necessary that a Street Commissioner be ap-
pointed, by move and second duly made and carried W. L. Jones was unani-
mously chosen as Street Commissioner for the City of Lufkin, Texas, and
instructed to at once enter upon the discharge of his duties.

It having been reported to the City Commission that the exhaust pipe
from the Lufkin Foundry and Machine Company entered into the sewer pipe
of the City, by move and second duly made and carried, W. L. Jones, City
Inspector was instructed to at once take necessary steps to have such
action stopped.

It appearing that brush and timber had grown up to such extent that
it interfered with the service of the Power Line leading from the City

to the pumping plant at the City Reservoir, by move and second duly made and carried, it was ordered that such brush and timber be removed at once.

A petition was presented by J. J. Gunter et als, praying that a street light be placed at the intersection of Second Street and Dozier Avenue. After consideration of said petition, by move and second duly made and carried, it was ordered that such street light be erected as prayed for.

The question of having regulated the sewer disposal of the Lufkin Land & Lumber Company was duly discussed by the City Commission, after which by move and second duly made and carried, it was ordered that immediate steps be taken to have said Lufkin Land & Lumber Company make necessary improvements of said sewer disposal in order that it may conform to the State Laws governing such cases. City Manager was instructed to write S. M. Morris, General Manager of Lufkin Land and Lumber Company informing him of such action of the City Commission.

It appearing that the Streets of the City are in a deplorable condition, and that the City does not have the necessary graders to improve said streets, by move and second duly made and carried, it was ordered that a New Grader be bought.

The question of building a band stand in Firman's Park was discussed by the City Commission as to the location such band stand should be built, and by move and second duly made and carried, it was ordered that same be built on the North Side of said Fireman's Park.

Acting City Manager was instructed to notify City Marshall, R. L. Mayne that his services as City Marshall would not be required after September, 1st, 1920.

There being no further business to come before the meeting, by move and second duly made and carried, adjournment was taken.

Be it remembered that on this the 2nd day of September, A.D. 1920,
there was held a Call Meeting of the City Commission of the City of Lufkin,
Texas, at the Municipal Office thereof; present and presiding the Hon. E.E.
Woods, Mayor Protem, S. R. Parker, B. L. Zeagler and W. B. Treadwell, Com-
missioners, T. L. Dunn, City Secretary and Acting City Manager, when the
following proceedings were had, to-wit:-

It appearing that a necessity exists for the collection of back or de-
linquent taxes due the City of Lufkin, Texas, and that it is necessary
to employ an attorney to perform the duties incident to the bringing of
suits to collect such taxes, by move of S. R. Parker and second by ~~xxx~~
W. B. Treadwell, it was ordered that W. O. Seale be and is hereby appointed
City Attorney of the City of Lufkin, Texas, to perform all duties as re-
quired by State Statutes and Charter of the City of Lufkin, Texas. The
salary of such official to be \$100.00 per month, beginning Sept. 1st, 1920.

The law firm of Denman & Collins having heretofore been employed as
Attorneys to represent the City in all things in which an Attorney is re-
quired, and that a retainer fee of \$150.00 per month was being paid to
them, it was ordered that such services be and they are hereby terminated,
effective Sept. 1st, 1920.

There being further business to come before the meeting, by move and
second duly made and carried, adjournment was taken.
