MINUTES OF Regular MEETING OF THE CITY COMMISSION
OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS, HELD March 6
1945, AT 7:30 P.M.

On this the 6 day of March, A. D. 1945,
the City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas, convened in
Regular session, in the regular meeting place in said City,

being present, and the following absent: W. M. Glenn
constituting a quorum when the following business was transacted.

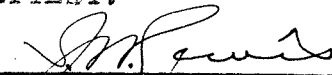
- 1 Minutes of February meetings were read and regularly approved.
2. Application of S. N. Berry for change of Zone District on Lot 4 in Block 4 of the Kimmey Addition at the intersection of Kimmey Street and Lufkin Avenue, from District E to District F, in order to permit building for use as grocery store was presented.
3. Also a written recommendation from the Zoning Committee of the City, that the application be granted was presented, and on motion of Arthur Temple, Jr., second by B. F. Milligan, and carried by unanimous vote the application and recommendation were accepted and public hearing was set for 10:00 A.M. March 20, 1945.
- 4 Mr. Brown and Mr. Murphy from Tyler and Mr. Irwin, all with the Lufkin Transit Company were present, and Mr. Brown discussed with the Commission the operation of the City buses, and told the Commission that it would be satisfactory with the owners of the bus Company to change the rate of Gross Receipt Tax on their operation from the present rate to a straight 2 per cent.
- 5 Mr. Brown also stated that their plans ~~providing~~ for an extension of the bus service in Lufkin as soon as the conditions and regulations will permit.
6. Motion was made by Arthur Temple, Jr., second by B. F. Milligan, approving the change in the rate, and making it 2 per cent of the Annual Gross Receipt. Motion was carried by unanimous vote.
7. This date had been set by advertisement in the Lufkin Daily News for public hearing on the application of Elzie Nash for a permit to operate and additional taxi cab.

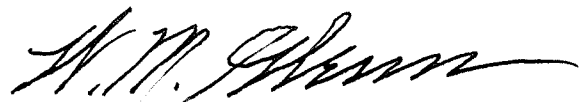
- 8 No one appeared to protest this application, and on motion of Arthur Temple, Jr., second by D. M. Thrash, and carried by unanimous vote, the application was granted.
9. A list of 491 small accounts of personal property taxes, amounting to \$3, 319.07, that were found to be uncollectable on the City Delinquent Tax Roll, and extending over a number of years was presented with recommendation by the City Tax Collector and City Attorney that they be charged off. It was moved by B. F. Milligan, second by Arthur Temple, Jr., and carried by unanimous vote that these accounts be charged off.
10. Resolution was offered by Arthur Temple, Jr., second by B. F. Milligan and carried by unanimous vote, ordering ~~that~~ the regular City Election to be held on April 3, 1945, and appointed J. S. Cauthen, Miss Claudia Sayers, Mrs. J. B. McConnico, and Mrs. R.C. Jordan as managers and judges of the election.

No further business was presented, so the meeting adjourned.
