MINUTES OF A CALL MEETING OF THE CITY
COMMISSION HELD JUNE 18th, A. D. 1929.

Be it remembered that on this the 18th day of June, A.D. 1929, there was begun and holden a call meeting of the City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas, at the City Hall thereof, with the following officers of the City present, to-wit:- Joe C. Denman, Mayor, C.E. Brazil, Commissioner of Ward No. 1, C.A. Burke, Commissioner of Ward No. 2, R.C. Jordan, Commissioner of Ward No. 3, W.A. Abney, Commissioner of Ward No. 4, V.R. Smitham, City Manager and W. O. Seale, City Attorney and T. L. Dunn, City Secretary, when the following proceedings were had, to-wit:-

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The purpose of the meeting was to pass on first reading an ordinance making tax levy for the year 1929, and to do and perform such other business as might properly come before the meeting.

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It appearing that fourth street from its intersection with south line of Lufkin Avenue to its intersection with north end of Homer Blvd. had been paved in accordance with contract with Scott Shambaugh, and that V.R. Smitham City Manager and City Engineer had recommended in writing the acceptance of same it was moved by C A Burke and Seconded by W A Abney that said street be accepted. Said motion carried unanimously.

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K.W. Denman and C.B. Richardson, a committee from the Chamber of Commerce met with the City Commission in behalf of a proposition to build an Air Port. The Matter was discussed, after which the Mayor appointed C.A. Burke and R.C. Jordan as a committee to work with the Chamber of Commerce Committee with the instruction to work out some plan in connection with the proposition if possible, and to report to this City Commission at some future date.

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It appearing that the two inch water line on old Homer and Alto road should be extended to the City limits on condition that not less than two new connections would be made ~~inside~~ by residents inside the city limits and three outside, it was moved by C.A. Burke and seconded by C.E. Brazil that such extension be made as per conditions above set forth.

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An ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE PRESCRIBING THE TAXES TO BE LEVIED, ASSESSED AND COLLECTED BY THE CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS, FOR THE YEAR 1929, AND FOR EACH YEAR THEREAFTER UNTIL OTHERWISE PROVIDED", was presented for passage and approval on first reading. C.A. Burke made a motion and same was seconded by R C Jordan that said ordinance be placed on first reading and that same pass first reading. said motion carried by the following vote "Ayes"- Joe C. Denman, C E Brazil, R C Jordan and W A Abney- Noes- None.

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There being no further business to come before the meeting, on motion duly made and carried same adjourned.

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The above and foregoing minutes read and approved on this the 2nd day of July, A. D. 1929.

MINUTES OF A CALL MEETING OF THE CITY COMMISSION
OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN HELD JUNE 18th A. D. 1929.

Be it remembered that on this the 18th day of June A. D. 1929, there was begun and holden a call meeting of the City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas, at the Municipal Hall thereof with the following members present, to-wit: Joe C. Denman, Mayor; C. E. Brazil, Commissioner Ward No. 1; C. A. Burke, Commissioner Ward No. 2; R. C. Jordan, Commissioner Ward No. 3; W. A. Abney, Commissioner Ward No. 4; V. R. Smitham, City Manager; T. L. Dunn, City Secretary, and W. O. Seale, City Attorney, when among other matters the following proceedings were had, to-wit:

It appearing to the City Commission that that portion of one street, viz:

1. Fourth Street from its intersection with south line of Lufkin Avenue to its intersection with north end of Homer Blvd., approximately 24.35 feet in width, plus curb and gutter,

has been completed according to contract for street paving with Scott Shambaugh of Houston, Texas, of date Aug. 24th A. D. 1928, and the acceptance of said street has been recommended in writing by City Engineer and City Manager, Mr. V. R. Smitham; on motion C. A. Burke, seconded by W. A. Abney, all voting yea, said street was accepted from Scott Shambaugh, paving contractor, and said improvement on said street is now received and accepted by the City.

The Mayor and City Secretary are hereby authorized and directed to issue improvement assessment certificates therefor in accordance with the assessments ordinance heretofore passed, a form of said assessment certificates has heretofore been approved for use in the present paving program, which is in all respects approved.
