

MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING OF THE CITY COMMISSION
OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS, HELD April 5th.
1955, AT 7:00 P.M.

On this the 5th day of April, A. D. 1955,
the City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas, convened
in regular session, in the regular meeting place in

¹ The meeting was opened with prayer by Mayor Woodrow Scott.

² The minutes of the regular meeting held March 16, 1955, were read and approved.

³ The election returns of the election held on April 5, 1955, were canvassed and Woodrow W. Scott was declared elected Mayor; Granville Wright, Commissioner from Ward 1; W. F. Collins, Commissioner of Ward 3.

⁴ Mrs. R. C. Musslewhite, Mrs. B. O. Watts and Mrs. Doyle Anderson appeared before the Commission in the interest of the City Federation of Women's Clubs and requested a building site in the Lufkin City Park. The matter was discussed, and it was agreed to give the Federated Clubs a long term lease, whereby they may erect a club building on a portion of the City Park property.

⁵ Zone change was granted W. R. Bailey from "A" District to "B" District on Lots Numbers 3 and 4 in Block No. 1 of the Gibson Addition. Zone change was granted from "B" District to "H" District on Lots 14, 15 and 16 in Block No. 1 of the Clark Addition, being property owned by R. B. Thompson.

6 Zone change application of O. L. McFaddin was ordered published for final hearing on the first Tuesday of May, for his change from "A" District to "F" District on Lot No. 1, Block 1, and Lot 1, Block 2, of the W. J. Noble Addition to the City.

7 A blinker light was ordered installed on U. S. Highway #69 in front of the entrance to Texas Foundries, Inc.

Repeat { 8 It was agreed to install parking meters on one side of the street in the area of the Lufkin Foundry & Machine Company office buildings on Kiln Avenue, and the City Manager was authorized to install such parking meters upon receipt of a letter requesting such installation from the Lufkin Foundry & Machine Company.

9 The proposition of L. L. Parrish for a small portion of his land for street right-of-way leading into the new Armory Building was declined, and the City Manager was authorized to write him a letter advising him of such action of the City Commission.

10 A letter was read from the Angelina County Lumber Company wherein they agreed to make certain improvements and recommendations free of charge relating to the timber on the Jones Lake and City Lake property.

11 The City Commission agreed to accept a street dedication deed from James E. Walker dedicating to the City a portion of Wilson Alley in the North section of the City.

12 It was agreed to discontinue parking meters on the South side of a portion of Dozier Avenue, just opposite Brookshire Brothers Warehouse and Henderson-Medford Motor Company. Parking along such area is to be prohibited to relieve congested traffic along such portion of Dozier.

13 There being no further business to come before the Commission, the meeting was adjourned.
