OF THE CITY OF LUPKIN, TEXAS, HELD MAY 28th, 1925.

Be it remembered that on this the 28th day of May, A. D. 1925, there came on and was held a call meeting of the Honorable City Commission of the City of Lufkin, in the City Hall of said City, present and presiding the following officers:— J. W. Hawkins, Mayor, Joe C. Denman, City Commissioner of Ward No. 1, A. M. Walker, Commissioner of Ward No. 2, W.A. Behannon, Commissioner of Ward No. 3, K. Hoskins, Commissioner of Ward No. 4, C. N. Humason, City Manager, W. U. Seale, City Attorney, and T. L. Dunn, City Secretary, when the following proceedings were had, to-wit:-

The mayor stated that the purpose of the meeting was to receive the report of right-of-way committee for sewer line purposes leading to site number three, and discuss further the exact location of the plant at site number three, and also discuss water improvements and such other business as may come before the commission.

Gity manager, C. N. Humason, reported for the right-of-way Committee gor sewer line to site number three as follows: Allowners of land through except A. B. Youngblood, which the proposed sewer line will run agreed that no charge would be made forrgth-of-way and that the only consideration they would demand, would be that the City pay any damage that might be done to growing crops, timber etc. and that they might be allowed to connect their premises to the sewer line on the same terms and conditions as if they lived in the city limits and as is granted to other citizens. A. B. Youngblood demanded the sum of \$100.00 for right-of-way privileges to his land.

It was moved by A.M. Walker and seconded by Joe C. Denman that the above report be accepted, which said motion carried unanimously, and the Gity Attorney was instructed to prepare right-of-way deeds, leases or easements for executionby the different property owners throught whose land the sewer line would pass up to A. B. Youngbladd's land.

There seeming to be some question as to what type of sewer plant the City should build, it was moved by A.M. Walker and seconded by Joe C. Denman, that H. L. Thackwell go to Austin, Texas, for the purpose of conferring with the State Sanitary Engineer as to just what type or types

would meet with his approval, the city to pay the actual expense of the The motion carried unanimously.

There being no further business to come before the meeting, by move and second duly made and carried same adjourned.
