

MINUTES OF Regular MEETING OF THE CITY COMMISSION
OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS, HELD August 1,
1944 AT 7:30 P.M.

On this the 1 day of August, A.D. 1944,
the City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas, convened in
Regular session, in the regular meeting place in said

being present, and the following absent: Arthur Temple, Jr.,
constituting a quorum when the following business was transacted:

1. All meetings held during the month of July was read and regular approved.
2. The matter of releasing to the Railroad Company, the property at the intersection of Herndon and Dozier, that is under lease to the City for street purposes, was discussed but was deferred to a later meeting for action.
3. Some time was spent in discussion on Post War Projects for the City, and it was brought out that among the improvements urgently needed are an additional water Pipe Main from the Pumping Plant to the City and also an additional Sanitary Sewer Main from the City to the Sewage Disposal Plant, and perhaps an enlargement of the plant.
4. Mr. J. B. Nolen, and Mr. Watson, with the State Liquor Law Enforcement Department were present and talked about enforcement of the City Taxicab Ordinance, and reports that the City Taxi Cabs are making long trips outside the City.
5. Enforcement of the 2 hour parking Ordinance was discussed, and it was brought out that numerous complaints had been made about the manner in which it has been enforced. After the discussion, motion was made by D. M. Thrash, second by Jr. A. Abney that the 2 hour parking ordinance be enforced with no local residents being exempted. All Commissioners voted Yea-Mayor voted Nay.

No further business was presented and the meeting was closed.
