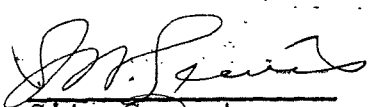
1. The Mayor announced that hearings would be had on the application for change of Zone District from "A" to "M" on a ~~xxxxx~~ piece of land beginning at the Gear Plant of the Lufkin Foundry & Machine Company West of Raguet Street, Six Hundred Feet Wide and extending along Harrell Street to the Southwest boundary line of the property now owned by the Lufkin Foundry & Machine Company.
2. Mrs. Harrell and R.E.Schuller were present but there was no objection offered to the proposed change.
3. Motion was made by Arthur Temple, Jr., second by D. M. Thrash and carried by all members voting yea, that the ~~ord~~ ordinance providing for the change of the Zone District as requested be passed on first reading.
4. Motion was then made by D. M. Thrash, second by B. F. Milligan and carried by all members voting yea that the ordinance be passed on second and final reading.
5. The ordinance is attached and made a part of these minutes.
6. Mr. Lewis made report of an offensive drainage problem at the Air Port caused by waste water from septic tanks and other drainage from the Federal Forestry property that is running in an open ditch around the East end of the Air Port at the entrance and near the office and hangars.
7. Application had been made for permission to pipe this drainage into a Storm Sewer in the Air Port grounds but this did not meet with favor and suggestion was made that the Government might arrange for extension of the City Sanitary Sewer Line from the City Limits in order to take care of the Sewage.
8. Mr. Lewis also reported that the Lufkin Independent School District, through Superintendent Wells, proposed to use the Central Ward school grounds for Summer Playgrounds and Supervise the activities if the City would pay the salary of the recreation director, \$65.00 per month, and without formal action the arrangement was approved.

Nothing further was presented for attention and the meeting was adjourned.
