

Lufkin Texas June 6th 1898.

The Council met pursuant to adjournment of June 5th 1898 with Mayor J. C. Mautsch Presiding and Aldermen W. H. Hearn, J. H. Kaygood and J. H. present. Mr. W. H. Hearn presented City Atty. E. B. Robb. and Sec. W. H. Hearn. It was voted by the Council that the Mayor be vested with the authority to purchase such stationery as he may see fit for the use of the City only.

The following ordinance was passed

Act 172 Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Lufkin that it shall be unlawful for any person to hitch any animal to any tree fence building or awning post or pole on the streets alleys side walks and public grounds within the Corporate limits of the ~~town~~ ^{City}. And any person violating the this law shall be fined in any sum not less than one dollar nor more than five dollars. all ordinances in conflict with this is hereby repealed.

Act 173 Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Lufkin that every Alderman shall be fined three dollars for each meeting which he fails to attend unless on account of sickness of his own or that of his family any member of the City Council remaining absent for three regular consecutive meetings of the board unless by sickness without first notifying

obtained leave of absence at a regular meeting shall be deemed to have vacated his office and the Mayor shall proceed to fill the vacancy in accordance with law.

Act 74 Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Lufkin that every able bodied male inhabitant within the incorporated limits of the City of Lufkin above Eighteen years of age except ministers of the Gospel shall be required to work on the public roads streets alleys and public grounds and highways in said City not exceeding five days in any one year or furnish a substitute or the sum of seventy five Cents for every day work demanded all ordinances in conflict with this is hereby repealed.

Act 75 Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Lufkin Texas that if any person liable under ~~under~~ the ordinance of this City to work upon the streets alleys squares and highways within the City of Lufkin Texas shall willfully fail or refuse to attend within person or by substitute at the time and place designated by the Marshal of said City of Lufkin Texas after being legally summoned or shall fail on or before the day for which he is summoned to attend to pay for to such Marshal the sum of seventy five Cents per day for each day

He may be notified to work on the streets alleys squares and highways or having attended shall fail to perform any duty required of him by the ordinances and such ~~person~~ ^{person} shall be fined in any sum not to exceed five dollars for each day he may so fail and refuse to perform such work all ordinances in conflict with this is hereby repealed.

The Council then adjourned until 10^o a.m. June 7th 1898.

The salary of the Mayor was fixed at two dollars for each day he shall preside ~~of~~ over Council meetings.
