- 1. Meeting opened with prayer by City Manager Marvey Wosterholm in the absence of Chaplai..
- 2. Mayor Garrison welconed visitors present.

3. Approval of Minutes

Minutes of regular meeting of January 18 1983 were approved on a motion by Commissioner Don Boyd and seconded by Commissioner Pat Foley. A unanimous affirmative vote was recorded.

4. <u>PUBLIC HEARING - Limousine Franchise - Ronalc Davis & 'b, a S.O. Limousine Service</u>

Mayor Garrison officially opened public hearing to consider a request by Ronald Davis d/b/a S.Q. Limousine Service for a franchise to operate a Limousine Service in the City Limits of Lufkin. There was no opposition present and no comment regarding proposed franchise. Nayor Garrison officially closed public hearing and stated that this was the first limousine service in the City of Lufkin, and he wished Mr. Davis well in his new venture.

5. Ordinance Approved - Jacond Reading - 5.Q. Limousine Service - Vehicle for Lire - mierded

Mayor Garrison stated that the ordinance amending vehicle for hire ordinance to allow operation of a Livousine Service in the City of Luckin had been approved on first reading at last meeting of this Commission.

Potion was made by Commissions Percy Simond and seconded by Commissionar Pat Toley that ordinance amending vehicle for hire ordinance to include lumousine franchise be approved on second reading as presented. A unanimous affirmative vote was recorded.

6. Election Order - Approved - Legular City Legular - April 2, 1983

Mayor Garrison stated that the refuser City Thection scheduled for April 2, 1983, would be for the election of Commissioner of Ward No. 1 and Commissioner of Mard No. 3. Mayor eachison further stated that the election order contained the proposed judges for each Ward and location of polling places.

Motion was made by Commissioner E.C. Vascing and seconded by Commissioner lat Fole: that election order be approved on first and final reading as presented. A unanimous affirmative vote was recorded.

7. Cift - Accepted - Electronic Scorebolia - kit McConnico Park - Richard Nolley Field Designated

Mayor Garrison stated that a letter had been received from Mrs Debbie Holley stating that her husband had met an untimely death and because of his involvement in the City Softball Program, she would like to donate three (3) electronic scoreboards to be used at Kit McConnico Park. Mayor Garrison further stated that Mrs. Holley requested that Field 2 be maked Richard Holley Field in honor of her husband.

In answer to question by Commissioner Richard Thompson, on Hannabas Parks and Recreation Director stated that installation of the scoreboards would cost the City approximately \$1500.00. Mr. Hannabas further stated that the Sco Choards would cost approximately \$1,960.00 each.

Motion was made by Commissioner Pat Poley and seconded by Commissioner Don Boyd that the gafe be accepted with Chanks from the City Commission and Field +2 1. named Pichard Molley Field. It unanimous affirmative your was recorded

Mayor Garrison stated that sids had been received for the purchase of uniforms for various City D purument . Havor Carrison so ted that it was the opinion of Ron Vesch, Puella Velks Director, and the alternate bid of J.C. Penny would be the most of appropriate to the City.

Commissioner Richard Thomoson stated that 0.0 Penny was the only bidder submitting an alternate bid and the opportunity to offer alternate bids should be provided each of the other bidges. Commissioner Thompson further stated that the tail thing would be to re-advertise for bids on the unifor w.

Mayor Garrison stated that unless empryone were asked to hid on the alternate specifications, all plus should be rejected and a new advertisement publics d.

Motion was made by Commissioner Pat Foley and Scienced by Commissioner Richard Thompson that all bids be rejected with uniformateing advertised for new bids. A unanimous affirmative vote was recorded.

In answer to question by Commissioner E.C. Wareing, Ar. Wesch stated that the new bids would allow for swill or two (2) ply material.

Mayor Garrison states that he was concerned about the reason for flaps on the shires. Ros Yeuch, Public Works Director, stated that the major reason was that when the men wase working in the ditenes they could loose items from their pockets and rise could shill the pocket contents.

In answer to question by Column size of I ray Limona, Ton Vesch, Public Works Director stated that the diese time on the sanitation truck broke, sprayed crosel on the orb and origine, and then ignited. Commissioner Percy Simona stated that he felt there was a discrepancy between the amount the interance company paid and the cost of the repairs. Public Vorks will alor non-Wesch stated that he had not with the injurance representative at Greater Lufkin Ford where the truck was viewed, and the insurance agent was steadfast in his appraisal of the closs.

Mayor Garrison stated that repairs should begin on the sanitation truck, and consideration should be given to better insurance coveragin the future.

Motion was made by Commissioner Pat Foley and seconded by Commissioner Percy Simond that low bid of Gibbs Leter Company in the amount of \$24,077.41 be accepted to include installation of a factory rebuilt engine. A unanimous affirmative vote was recorded.

Commissioner E.C. Wareing stated that inquiries should be made regarding the premium amount the City would pay for insurance coverage without a deduction on sanitation truck. Mayor Garrison stated that most insurance companies provide for requir of the vehicle to the original condition before loss, and the matter should be investigated further.

9. <u>Executive Session - Dawsui - Outfill Tower Line - Exchange of Property - Discussed</u>

Mayor Garrison stated that it was madensary for the City Commission to adjourn into an executive session to discuss various matters. Mayor Garrison recessed formal open meeting of the ricy Commission at 8:00 p.m. At 8:33 p.m. Favor Garrison reconvened regular meeting of City Commission and made announces ands to individuals present regarding results of the executive ression.

Mayor Garrison stated that the city Commission discussed three (3) items during executive session: a lawsuit presently pending against the City, the location of property for he putfill sower line, and the possible exchange of property between the City and another entity Mayor Garrison stated that the City Manager has been authorized to proceed with negotiations in these regards, and a statement would be made at a later date.

10. Conmunity Development Block Crant - louic e Bill - . mas Lunicipal League

Commissioner Don Bovd requested intormation about the Community Development Block Grant and when recipients would be announced. Cit Manager Harvey Westerholm stated that he had spoken with Randy Blanks of DETCOG recertly and an announcement could be made this week in regard to distribution of the grants.

Commissioner Percy Simond requested information regarding the Pothole Bill now before the regislature, and the amount of money the City of Lufkin might receive in this regard. City Manager Harvey Westerholm stated that the City had turned in a request for 223.5 miles of baved street for a total of φ^{20} ,000.00. City Manager Westerholm further stated that his legislation was now pending before the regislature.

Commissioner Percy Simond requested information on how the cities become aware of the different bulks before the legis ature. City Manager Westerholm stated that at Thi Conventions resolutions are discussed, and this helps the cities to know what is being considered.

Commissioner Pat Foley states into Recien. "16 of T. I has a representative that serves on the logiculature committee. Commissioner Percy Samend stated that he felt the City of Lufkin did not requive enough representation on the TML Boards. Mayor Garrison stated that TML operators thrown regions with a representative on the board of directors from each region. Mayor Carrison further stated that the City of Luftin is so far removed from the center of Region 16 that it is difficult for the Commission to participate in the activities. Mayor Garrison further stated that to receive recognition you must participate in the majority of TML activities. Mayor Carrison further stated that the TML regions should be realigned to provide a politer opportunity for each city to participate.

Commissioner E.C. Vareins at tell that angene could submit recommendations to the "ML resolution committee, and the City of Lufkin had not been active in the least nunicipal League. Commissioner Percy Sthood states that the City of Lufkin should a resolution for the realignment of the regions, and our Mayor and Mayor pro ten should be sent to the Conference of Mayors each year.
