HELD JANUARY 14th, 1935.

Be it remembered that on this the 14th day of January, 1935, there was

The following proceedings were had, to-wit:-

The purpose of the meetings was to read and approve bills and do
and perform any other legal business that might come before the body.

All bills and accounts due by the City to various parties, firms
and corporations were read to the City Commission, and it appearing that
such of said bills has been properly approved for payment by the City
Manager should be paid, it was moved and carried that such bills be
paid.

An Ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE LEVYING AN ANNUAL OCCUPATION
TAX UPON ALL MACHINES AND OTHER DEVICES OF WHATSOEVER KIND AND DESCIP-
TION OPERATED BY COINS, METAL SLUGS, OR TOKENS SIMILAR TO COINS FOR THE
PURPOSE OF AMUSEMENT, ENTERTAINMENT, OR VENDING COMMODITIES, MERCHANDISE
OR CONFECTIONS, OR FOR SERVICES OF ANY KIND, EXEMPTING PAY TELEPHONES,
GAS METERS AND SANITARY DRINKING CUP VENDING MACHINES FROM THE PROVIS-
IONS OF THIS ORDINANCE; AND PROVIDING THAT ALL ORDINANCES AND PARTS OF
ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH ARE HEREBY REPEALED, AND DECLARING AN
EMERGENCY", was introduced for passage and approval.

W. A. Abney made a motion which was seconded by Louis Hicks that
said ordinance be placed on first reading and that it pass first read-
ing, and further that the rules requiring that all ordinances be read
on two several days before their passage, be suspended and that said
ordinance shall be in full corce and effect from and after its passage.
The motion was put by the mayor, and the following is the recorded vote
on same: "Ayes"- C.A.Burke, W.O.Greene, Louis Hicks, D.A.Campbell and
W.A.Abney. "Noes"- None- Whereupon the mayor declared the motion car-
ried and the ordinance finally passed and approved according to its
