

MINUTES OF A CALL MEETING OF
THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF
LUFKIN, TEXAS, HELD JAN. 25, 1921.

-----oOo-----
A call meeting of the City Commission was held on this the 25th day of January, 1921, with the following members of said Commission present: G. A. Kelley, Mayor, E. E. Woods, B. L. Zeagler and W. B. Treadwell, Commissioners. Commissioner S. R. Parker being absent.

The Mayor announced that the purpose of the meeting was to take up and re-consider and application and the action of the City Commission on same heretofore made, on Jan. 19th, 1921, whereby A. Stroud made an application for a special permit for the construction of an Corrugated Iron Building within the Brick limits of the City of Lufkin, and at which time said special permit was granted.

After the announcement by the Mayor as aforesaid, the matter in hand was thoroughly and intellgently gone into, after which E. E. Woods made a motion, which was seconded by W. B. Treadwell, that the order heretofore granted giving said special permit be re-cinded. The question was put by the mayor, and each members present voted "Aye". Whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried, and instructed the City Secretary to notify the said A. Stroud of the action of said Commission.

J. A. Saxon, a member of the firm of Saxon Mercantile Company, appeared before the City Commission and represented that an error had been made in taking the tax rendition of the said Saxon Mercantile Company for taxed for the City for the year 1920, in that he wanted to render the property of said Saxon Mercantile Company at 75% of the amount of the inventory as of date Jan. 1st, 1920, but that an error had been made by the assessor in calculating the said 75% as aforesaid. After having heard the above matter and investigated same, it appears to the City Commission that an error had been made as stated, and that a correction should be made on the tax rolls of the City so that same will show the facts in the case. Therefore the City Tax Collector was instructed to make the said correction by changing or reducing the rendition from \$17,560. to \$15,515.

Complaint having been made repeatedly by the contractors ~~taxi~~ who having under way the paving of certain streets in the City of Lufkin, Texas, to the effect that persons are guilty of deliberately permitting water to flow upon uncompleted streets, thereby making it absolutely impossible for the streets to dry out sufficient for them to advance with the work of paving the streets. The matter having been duly and carefully considered by the City Commission, it was moved by B. L. Zeagler, and seconded by E. E. Woods, that the City attorney be instructed to take the necessary steps to have such action stopped. The question having been put by the mayor, each member present voted "Aye". and the Mayor declared the motion carried.

There being no further business to come before the meeting, by move and second duly made and carried, adjournment was taken.
