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MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING OF THE  
CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS,  
HELD NOVEMBER 5th, 1935.

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Be it remembered that on this the 5th day of November A.D. 1935, there was begun and holden a regular meeting of the City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas, at the Municipal Office in said City, with the following officers of the City present and presiding, to-wit:

The following proceedings were had, to -wit:-

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Minutes of meetings held during the month of October, 1935, were read and on motion duly made and carried, were approved as read.

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J. B. Broderick, representing the Angelina Building Material Company, was present and made a proposal to buy or trade for the warehouse and lease located on Herndon Street at the intersection of Mantooth Avenue. He explained that they needed more room for expansion of their business and would like to have all buildings and property connected, so that such buildings would not be scattered on different locations. He further explained that if the city preferred they would buy the warehouse outright and <sup>the city</sup> build another for ~~the~~ its use, or they would rebuild for the city on a different location in consideration of an an exchange of properties. The matter was taken under consideration, and a promise to see if a suitable location could be found after which the said Angelina Building Material Company would be notified whether or not such a trade would be made.

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A Mr. Hall was present and complained against W. C. Turner, Police-man about hitting and abusing him in an <sup>difficulty</sup> ~~incident~~ growing out of incident wherein the said Mr. Hall ran his truck over a dog belonging to the said Turner. The matter was thoroughly discussed and the Mayor appointed himself as a committee of one to look into the matter and discuss it further with the two parties and report his recommendations to the City Commission at a later date.

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The question of settlement of old paving judgments growing out of transactions wherein a lot of paving was done in the year 1920.

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It was made know to the City Commission that the judgments obtained in the various cases had become dormant and could not be collected unless they were revived as provided by law. Then the question arose as to whether the City should release the various parties from the judgments or revive them or let them remain as they are. It was finally decided that said judgments would not be released, but no order was made to revive them, but it was moved by D.A. Campbell and seconded by W.A. Abney that settlement of such judgments would be accepted if payment of the original or principal amount of the judgment was paid; no interest to be added. The motion carried unanimously.

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A resolution entitled "RESOLUTION AND ORDER BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS, CALLING AN ELECTION ON THE QUESTION OF THE ISSUANCE OF FOURTEEN THOUSAND (\$14,000.00) DOLLARS REVENUE BONDS FOR THE PURPOSE OF MAKING CERTAIN REPAIRS, EXTENSIONS AND IMPROVEMENTS TO THE WATERWORKS SYSTEM OF SAID CITY AND THE PLEDGING OF THE REVENUE OF THE SYSTEM TO THE PAYMENT THEREOF" was introduced for passage and approval.

W. O. Greene made a motion, which was seconded by Louis Hicks, that said resolution be passed and approved. The mayor put the question and the following is the recorded vote on the motion: "Ayes"— Kenneth Hoskins, W. O. Greene, Louis Hicks, D.A. Campbell and W.A. Abney. "Noes"— None.

Whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried and the resolution passed and approved. (See another page of these minutes for a record of the resolution)

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In connection with the city's application for loan and grant to the PWA for funds for improvement to waterworks system, which has been approved by the President, and given Docket No. TEX-1776, the United States of America now offers to purchase its waterworks revenue bonds to be issued for purpose of providing securities for the city's part of the cost of such project. The offer of the United States of America having been read to the City Commission, it was moved by W. O. Greene, and seconded by W.A. Abney that said offer be accepted, and the following resolution entitled "A RESOLUTION ACCEPTING THE OFFER OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA TO THE CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS, TO AID BY WAY OF LOAN AND GRANT IN FINANCING THE CONSTRUCTION OF IMPROVEMENTS AND EXTENSIONS TO WATERWORKS SYSTEM", be passed and approved.

The Mayor put the question and the following is the recorded vote on the motion "Ayes"— Kenneth Hoskins, W. O. Greene, Louis Hicks, D.A. Campbell and W.A. Abney. "Noes"— None. Whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried and the said resolution passed and approved.

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Bills and accounts due various parties, firms and corporations were presented for payment and it appearing that such of said bills as had been approved for payment by the city Manager should be paid, on motion duly made and carried were ordered paid.

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There being no further business to come before the meeting on motion duly made and carried, it adjourned.
