constituting a quorum when the following business was transacted.

Upon motion of B. F. Milligan and seconded by D. M. Thrash, August bills in the amount of \$3,843.44 were ordered paid, by unanimous vote.

It was moved by B. F. Milligan and seconded by J. A. Abney, that a public hearing be held at the next regular meeting to be held October 2, 1945, at 7:30 P. M. on all Taxi Cab applications now on file. The motion was carried unanimously and the City Manager authorized to have notice of same published in the Lufkin Daily News, according to law. Applications covered by the above motion were:

Gordon Odum and Lee Bishop,---Three Permits  
Charlie Malone,-----Two Permits  
Braker Alexander,-----One Permit

It was moved by D. M. Thrash, and seconded by J. A. Abney, that the City not permit the operation of any substitute Taxi Cabs within the City, in the future. The motion was carried by unanimous vote.

A brief discussion was held concerning the type of bids to ask for on a new twelve-inch Water line, from the Pump Station into the City.

No further business was presented, so the meeting adjourned.
