

MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS, HELD ON JULY 2, 1940 AT 7:30 P. M.

The City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas convened in regular session in the regular meeting place on July 2, 1940 at 7:30 p.m. with the following members present:

and the following absent: NONE, constituting a quorum when the following business was had:

1. Minutes of the regular meeting held on June 4, 1940 and the minutes of the called meetings held on the 7th, 18th, 22nd and 27th days of June were read, approved and adopted as read.

2. Mr. C. L. DuPuy appeared before the Council with a sketch of a proposed building on the Cotton Belt right-of-way between Second and Third Streets which he proposed to erect for the purpose of housing his Buick Agency. He asked that the fire restrictions be released, and showed the Commission that the building would not be a fire hazard in view of the fact that it was to be made out of concrete, brick and metal. Upon motion of Commissioner R. E. Melvin, seconded by Commissioner J. E. Jay, it was moved and carried that Mr. DuPuy be authorized to build the building in accordance with his statement of the plans and specifications.

3. Mr. R. A. Corbett appeared with a request to transfer a taxicab license from Roy Roberts, he having purchased the taxicab from Roy Roberts. It appearing to the Council that this transfer would not mean the putting on of an additional taxicab, it was moved by Commissioner J. E. Jay, seconded by Commissioner W. D. Winston, Jr. that the transfer be approved.

4. Application of Vernon Bradford and Jim Hale for a new taxicab permit was read and upon motion of Commissioner G. E. Barington, seconded by Commissioner J. E. Jay, the permits were refused on the grounds that there was no public convenience and necessity.

5. Upon motion of Commissioner W. D. Winston, Jr., seconded by Commissioner R. E. Melvin, it was ordered that V. G. Koch be reimbursed in the amount of \$35.00 each for the 100 houses constructed beyond the water line. This payment being a repayment of the expenses of laying the water lines as per an agreement made with Mr. Koch several months ago.


6. Upon motion of Commissioner G. E. Barington, seconded by Commissioner R. E. Melvin, the salary of the City Attorney was increased to \$200.00 a month out of which he is to pay his stenographer for the city. It being understood that this increase is to apply so long as there is extra work in connection with delinquent taxes and street improvements.


7. Upon motion of Commissioner G. E. Barington, seconded by Commissioner J. E. Jay, it was moved that the sewer and water line to Moore Addition east of Highway 103 be laid as soon as the city's finances will permit.

8. There being no further business to come before the meeting, the meeting was, upon motion duly made and carried, adjourned.
