Report of Rights of Way committee received stating conditions and price under which the city could lay Pipeline over property to city's new Pond.

Report follows: E. J. Mantoaka property for a cash consideration of \$2500 - Ang. Co. L. Co. property for the consideration that the city furnish water free for the Post Office building - Motion by Price seconded by Admorgen and motion carried.

secure the right of way for a definite cash consideration.
