ing business was transacted:

1. The meeting was opened with prayer by Mayor Woodrow W. Scott.

2. The Minutes of the Regular Meeting of September 21, were read and approved.

3. Ivy Williams, former Janitor, came before the Commission and claimed that he had a back injury and requested the City to pay him for such. The City Manager reported his communications with Ivy Williams and that Ivy had failed to cooperate in trying to get well.

4. A communication from the State Highway Department was read by the City Manager relative to the improvement on Lufkin Avenue. Such communication was to be approved or rejected by the Commission within 120 days from date thereof.

5. Robert Denum was appointed Right-Of-Way Agent for the City to obtain the right-of-way on the remaining options on the Lufkin Avenue street extension and he was authorized, if he could not trade with them, to make them an offer for the portion of their land needed for the right-of-way so that condemnation proceedings could get under way.

6. The City Manager read a communication from Kech and Fowler, Engineers, advising that they would make such supplemental report for water and sewer for the City of Lufkin, as previously requested, and stating that their price for such survey and report would be \$750. It was voted to accept such proposition. 7. The summer water rate was extended for a period of thirty days.

8. It was agreed to sell the Fenley property on Timberland Drive for \$7,500 or the house for \$4,500 and the lot for \$3,000.

9. The application of Charlie Malone for additional taxicab permit was considered and the publication of same was authorized for a hearing at the next meeting.

There being no further business to come before the Commission, the meeting adjourned.
